

KLAMATH FARMERS OBTAIN LOANS

The federal land bank of Spokane recently issued a statement showing operations of that concern in the various counties of Oregon from May, 1933, to January, 1936. Several copies have been sent to the county agent's office for the use of the farm-debt adjustment committee. It is interesting to note that during this period 140 farmers in Klamath county have secured loans either federal bank loans, land bank commissioner loans, or both. The report shows 74 straight federal land bank loans and 131 land bank commissioner loans. A total of \$314,000 of indebtedness was refinanced with land bank and commissioner loans, totalling \$706,000, or a reduction in indebtedness of \$198,000.

The report further shows that the estimated annual interest saving resulting from this financing to farmers in Klamath county was \$19,200.

Results for Oregon for the same period show a total of \$20,500, 143 loans used for refinancing to retro \$23,629,374 of indebtedness with an annual interest saving of \$558,163. A total of 3,997 farmers availed themselves of land bank loans and 4,819 obtained land bank commissioner loans during that period, or a total of 4,998 loans during the period.

KLAMATH STOCK WILL BE TESTED

Word has just been received from Dr. Sam B. Foster, in charge of eradication of tuberculosis and Bang's disease in dairy cattle in Oregon, for the U. S. bureau of animal industry, that another federal test will be undertaken in Klamath county just as soon as sufficient applications are received for this work. This test will be a combined test for Bang's disease and tuberculosis. The last T. B. test was taken in Klamath county three years ago, the county now being on an accredited area basis, requiring a test every three years. Two Bang's tests were undertaken during the past year and a third test will practically clean up the county as far as this disease is concerned.

Agreements for the Bang's test are on hand at the county agent's office, and all dairymen desiring this test should fill out one of these within the next ten days. No contract is required in the T. B. test, but application for this test should also be made at the county agent's office.

It is hoped to get the work under way before the end of June, so applications should be made immediately. No tests will be made unless specific application is made at the county agent's office.
