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SHORT SPUD CROP LOOMS FOR 1936

WASHINGTON, June 23, (AP)—The U. S. bureau of agriculture economists today estimated 23,500,000 bushels of potatoes will be produced this year, compared with 23,100,000 last year, and the 1928-35 average of 22,127,000 bushels.

The bureau's bulletin said: "The short crop indicated this year, coupled with a short supply of old potatoes carried over from last year, had contributed largely to the recent sharp price advance."

A gradual decline in prices as the season advances, is expected, the bureau said.

The national farm price average on May 15 was \$7.1 cents a bushel, \$1.1 cents on April 15; 44.6 cents a year ago, and 69.5 cents for the pre-war May average.

PROFIT TAKINGS CAUSE REACTION

CHICAGO, June 23, (AP)—Profit taking sales on advanced wheat led to a reaction today, and the greater part of overnight gains that in some places amounted to 4 cents a bushel.

The maximum bulge was at Minneapolis. Intensified drought, with predictions of a return of abnormal heat northwest formed the chief stimulus to skyrocketing of values.

Wheat closed irregular, 1c lower to 1c higher, compared with yesterday's finish, July 95c to 95c; September 96c to 96c; corn, 1c to 1c up, September 64c to 64c; oats unchanged to 1c advanced, and provisions unchanged to 15c down.
