

INCOME OF FARM PRODUCE GOES UP

SALEM, Ore., June 25. (UP)—Cash income from the sale of farm products in the west had increased only one per cent over the previous year by the first of May, U. S. department of agriculture statisticians reported.

The improvement lagged behind north central and north Atlantic agricultural districts, but compared favorably with the

south, where declines in income were recorded during the year's time.

Gains ranged from 7 to 11 per cent in the northern sections, while the south Atlantic region suffered an 11 per cent decrease and south central states 2 per cent. Average over the country was a 4 per cent gain.

The western states' average was brought down by decreases in farm income reported from Arizona, Washington and California. All other states in the division had increases larger than the one per cent reported for the region as a whole.

Truck crops, oranges, wheat and apples dropped 16 per cent

In the west for the 12-month period, but the decline was offset by a 13 per cent gain in the region's income from livestock items.

For the first four months of this year, however, western income was 9 per cent larger than in the same part of 1935, the department announced.

Bucking the downturn were standard oils of New Jersey, California and Indiana, Barnsdall, Texas Corp., Pure Oil, Fajardo Sugar, American Crystal Sugar, Holly Sugar, Spicer Mfg., and Motor Products.

Continental Corp. pointed upward when an initial payment on the new stock was voted.

Lima Locomotive did better as orders for a number of railway engines were booked. Fajardo and other sugars reflected signs of improvement in this field.

SUIT LAUNCHED TO FORCE STOCK SALE

Action to force a sheriff's sale of capital stock in KFJI Broadcasters held by Helen E. Kincaid and J. A. Kincaid was filed at the court house Wednesday by M. A. Hollingsworth, who in April of last year won a \$10,500 judgment against George Kincaid in a suit at Portland.

Hollingsworth says he has never recovered on his judgment, alleging that George Kincaid transferred his interest in KFJI Broadcasters as well as all his other real and personal property to his wife, Helen Kincaid, in order to avoid foreclosure on execution of the judgment.

In addition to asking a court order requiring the defendants, Helen Kincaid and J. A. Kincaid to deliver their stock to the sheriff for sale, Hollingsworth has also entered a request for an injunction restraining the defendants from any further transfer of the stock during pendency of the suit.

E. M. Morton and C. W. Kirk, Portland attorneys, are representing Hollingsworth.

DAMPER PLACED ON GRAIN UPTURN

CHICAGO, June 25. (AP)—For the second consecutive day, fears of possible heavy imports of Canadian wheat into the United States put a damper today on

Merrill Club Wants Route Farthest South Designated

Proposed changes in the secondary highways south of town connecting the Weed and The Dalles-California highways will be taken up with the state road commission by the county court at Portland Friday.

Members of the court will leave early Thursday for Bend, attending there a meeting of district No. 2 of the County Judges and Commissioners' association, and then will move on to Portland for a conference with the state highway group.

The court on Wednesday studied a letter from the Merrill Service club advocating the road from Mack's store southwest as the route to be placed in the secondary system, instead of one beginning at a point a mile north of the store.

The club cited the importance of making the connecting link as far south as possible to serve best the south end of the county.

Talk of changes in the secondary system developed after the highway board tentatively decided to shift the Weed-Klamath highway, from Midland to the state line, out of the secondary system and into the primary system.

When it was suggested the road from Midland to South Sixth street—the old Midland market road—be taken out of the secondary system, protests went up here from the court, the chamber of commerce and others. The commission indicated it would favor a secondary road farther south, either the one joining The Dalles-California at Mack's store, or a mile north of there.

Members of the court and County Engineer Frank Z. Howard said Wednesday that their first objective is to keep the Midland "market road" in the secondary system. They said that if the secondary system retains that road, takes in the Mack's
