

KLAMATH SEEKS EAGLES' CONCLAVE

SILVERTON, Ore., June 26. (AP)—Keen rivalry for the state presidency and choice of a 1937 convention city developed as the annual state convention of the Federal Order of Eagles went into its second day.

There were two names mentioned most prominently for the chief state office of the lodge. A. Warren Jones, Salem, retiring vice-president, was backed by a group headed by Barnett H. Goldstein of Portland, retiring president, and A. H. Bravwell, Medford, had behind him the

forces of D. D. Hall, Portland, state organizer. Aeries from Astoria and Klamath Falls were making a determined campaign for the bid as the 1937 convention city.

Meanwhile steps were being taken to develop an old age pension program, and H. J. Langlo and William E. Shooker of Portland and Dr. R. S. Scott of Astoria were named as an old age pension committee.

Committee reports made Thursday afternoon showed that the 38 aeries in the state had made a marked increase in membership, many having doubled and some trebled their last year's roll.

Speakers yesterday included National Vice-President H. B. Mehrmann of Oakland, Calif., and State Senator Walter E. Pearson, who represented Governor Martin.

STATE PLANNERS STUDY PENSIONS

PORTLAND, June 26. (AP)—Old age pensions and ways and means of financing them will become the object of an immediate survey of the Oregon planning board, Ormond R. Bean, chairman, said today.

Acting at the request of Gov. Martin, experts of the board under the direction of J. C. Rette, research consultant, will study

taxation trends in Oregon over a 15-year period to determine the availability of funds for pensions.

The productivity of the various tax sources will be analyzed by charts and extended to a per capita basis for each county and a comparison with other states, both on per capita revenue and methods of taxation employed elsewhere.

One objective will be an analysis of possibilities for reduction of public expenditures through consolidation of school districts and other adjustments of property taxes. The constitutionality of tax-raising methods also will be examined.

In its study, the board will have the cooperation of the league of Oregon cities and the bureau of municipal research at the University of Oregon.

HOPPER DAMAGE HIGH IN AMERICA

WASHINGTON, June 26. (AP)—Grasshopper damage over large areas was reported by the agriculture department as President Roosevelt approved a joint resolution by congress appropriating \$250,000 for control of insects.

The department planned to use the funds for co-operative control along the general lines of the 1934 emergency control campaign. A. S. Hoyt, acting chief of the bureau's entomology and plant quarantine division, said the appropriation was not large enough to provide protection against grasshoppers throughout the infested area and that fully effective control so late in the season would be difficult, especially where the insects have moved into the fields.

He added, however, that prompt distribution of poison bait would protect crops in many sections. All the material that can be purchased with the funds available will be shipped to the most seriously affected areas and to places where grasshoppers have not yet advanced so far as to be entirely beyond control.

Field headquarters for the work

have been established at Kansas City.

Grasshoppers are reported abundantly this year in Iowa, Kansas, Nebraska, Montana, California, Colorado, North Dakota, South Dakota, Michigan, Idaho, New Mexico, Nevada, Oregon, Utah, Wisconsin and Wyoming.

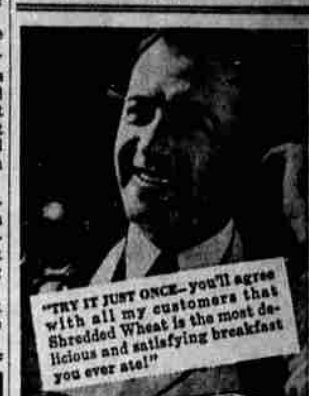
San Bernardino Forest Ravaged by Fierce Blaze

SAN BERNARDINO, Cal., June 26. (UP)—Three hundred civilian conservation camp workers fought through fire blackened canyons Thursday in a futile effort to check a raging forest fire that was completely out of control and threatening the vast San Bernardino forest preserves.

The fire, at first small and apparently inconsequential, had been burning since late yesterday. Today it suddenly erupted past control lines and began roaring down on the town of Devore.

The blaze burned up the west slope of the San Bernardino

range and was sweeping through Cajon pass. Forestry men said it was the worst blast in this area in two years.

PINE PRODUCTION FOR WEEK RISES

PORTLAND, Ore., June 26. (AP)—Lumber production in the pine belt the week ending June 26 was 16,170,000 feet greater than the corresponding week a year ago, reports of 117 mills to the Western Pine association showed today.

Orders totaled 69,550,000 feet, shipments 65,531,000 feet and production 81,076,000 feet. The same mills for the corresponding week a year ago showed orders 53,380,000 feet and production 73,325,000 feet. Orders are 12 per cent greater this year than for the corresponding period last year.
