

BANDIT'S EX-WIFE TO MARRY AGAIN

NAPA, Calif., July 2, (UP)—Florence Irene Gardner, 39-year-old former wife of Roy George Gardner, notorious mail train robber, and William Parkes, 40, attendant

at Napa state hospital, have filed notice of intention to wed. Mrs. Gardner obtained an annulment of her marriage June 6 from Superior Judge Percy King of Napa. Her annulment petition, filed April 21, alleged Gardner, when she married him in 1916, withheld information that he had been convicted and served time in San Quentin prison. Mrs. Gardner and Parkes did not make public the date they expect to be married.

HINDENBURG MAKES FOURTH CROSSING

LAKEHURST, N. J., July 2, (AP)—The German dirigible Hindenburg grounded at 4:20 a. m., eastern standard time, today, completing its fourth commercial flight

from Germany in record-breaking time. The big ship made the run from her home port, Frankfurt-on-Main, to Lakehurst in 52 hours and 51 minutes, cutting eight hours, 34 minutes from her previous record, Lieutenant George Watson of the naval air station announced. The Hindenburg's lines were made secure at 4:35 o'clock after she made what was said to be the first flying mooring ever made by a German airship. A ground crew was ready, but was not called upon, as the ship flew directly to the mast.

Father Identifies Lewis River Body

KELESO, Wash., July 2, (UP)—Charles Marshall, of Bradwood, Ore., near Astoria, Wednesday identified positively the body of a pretty woman found last Friday in the Lewis river near Woodland, Wash., as Marie Marshall Brown, 26, his daughter. MORE PETITIONS FILED AT SALEM

SALEM, July 2, (AP)—Four more sets of completed petitions for measures to appear on the November election ballot were in the hands of the secretary of state today.

Two of the measures were constitutional amendments, one limiting permissible state tax on real and tangible personal property payable in 1937, to six mills per dollar of assessed and equalized valuation, to be reduced annually to 4.8 mills in 1942. It was sponsored by the Oregon Taxpayers' association.

The other amendment would provide that the state board of control administer any laws enacted to carry out the provisions of the state water power and hydro-electric amendment, until the permanent board or commission is elected.
