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TRADE SLUGGISH ON PORTLAND MART

PORTLAND, July 7 (AP)—Trading on the farmers' east side market today was sluggish. Both supply and demand were low, largely a reaction from Monday's heavy sales.

Blackcaps were the bright spot in the berry section. Because of the growing scarcity prices ranged \$1.35-1.40 crate. Raspberries were easier, \$1.15-1.40. Currants brought \$1.15-1.25 generally.

Strawberries were stronger, \$1.90 to \$2.10.

Some nice Alexander peaches were offered at 75c per box.

Telephone pears came on with a rush and sold freely at 3c per lb.

Cabbage continued around \$1.15 crate.

Lettuce was fairly even at 70c.

Good housewife to make a brought \$5c to \$1.00 for fancy pack in 10 lb. boxes, and from 75 to 90c for standards of the same weight.

Celery continued its upward trend and advanced 5c to \$1.65 per crate.

New potatoes continued erratic with prices fluctuating as to quality. They ranged from \$1.50-2.00.

Bunch vegetables, squash, spinach and cauliflower prices remained about the same. Corn was little changed, selling at 20-25c per dozen.

SALEM, July 7 (AP)—The state highway commission today awarded the contract for the first work on the Wilsonville cut-off route from the Pacific highway to Portland to R. L. Houck of Salem at \$104,058. Bids were opened at a recent meeting of the commission but the contract was held up pending right-of-way matters.

The work will be started at once on what is known as the Butteville road-White school section, consisting of four miles of grading and construction of two small bridges in Marion county.

The contract for the undercrossing, a mile north of Hubbard, was expected to be let at the meeting of commission July 23.
