

ARCADE HOTEL ISSUE SETTLED

Judge E. B. Ashurst settled the case of Christ Blanas versus George Blanas and the Arcade Hotel corporation in circuit court Wednesday afternoon with an oral judgment which he said he "hoped would be satisfactory to all litigants concerned."

Plaintiff had alleged that 13 additional shares of stock in the corporation had been issued to George Blanas so that control in the company might be shifted from the Christ Blanas group of stockholders, as evidenced by the fact that the extra voting shares made possible defeat of directors and by-laws proposed by Christ Blanas at an April stockholders' meeting.

Plaintiff asked that the 13 shares be cancelled, their effect on the vote nullified, and approval of the Christ Blanas directors and by-laws confirmed.

Defendants alleged that the stock could not be withdrawn and George Blanas repaid without seriously threatening the corporation's financial condition.

Judge Ashurst ordered the stock cancelled with the provision George Blanas should be restored the money he had invested in it. Such action would not embarrass the corporation's finances, the judge declared, for accountings showed a cash balance of over \$1000 would remain after George Blanas had been refunded.

The judge also confirmed election of the Christ Blanas directors and approval of the Christ Blanas by-laws.

"Nobody has lost any money in this case, and you are right back where you started," Ashurst concluded.

STATE OPPOSES PENSION PARTY

PORTLAND, July 10. (UP)—Dr. Ralph I. Shaddock, state area manager of the Townsend organization, said Thursday the Oregon delegation to the Townsend convention at Cleveland would fight against any attempt at endorsement of third party candidates in this state.

"If the convention determines to form a third party we will fight for the candidates in the republican and democratic parties that we have already endorsed so that they may remain Townsend candidates in this area," said Dr. Shaddock.

200 Oregon Delegates "We don't want any Townsend candidates to oppose these candidates for congress. They have played fair with us and we want to continue the campaigns we have begun in their behalf."

Dr. Shaddock said 50 Portland Townsends will leave for Cleveland with him at 9 p. m. Saturday and will be joined by 150 other Oregon Townsends before the train leaves the state. He said the Pacific northwest delegation would total 600, and that it would have a powerful voice in affairs at Cleveland.

Strong for Doctor

"We have no spirit of opposition to national headquarters," Dr. Shaddock said. "Instead we believe we can deliver to Dr. Townsend a complete victory in the November election."

This was in contrast to the assertion by Theodore G. Nelson, Townsend delegate from Salem, who said before leaving for Cleveland that he would lead a movement to transfer control of the Townsend organization from Dr. Townsend to the "membership."
