

LAKE COUNTY WANTS ACTION ON HIGHWAY

Steps were taken Friday morning to call the roads and highway committee of the chamber of commerce into a meeting to plan a joint trip with Lakeview representatives to appear before the state highway commission in behalf of the Klamath Falls-Lakeview road.

Forrest Cooper, secretary of the Lake county chamber of commerce, stopped here to confer with Secretary E. C. Reynolds and others about the project.

Cooper said that Lake county chamber and court members are ready to join the Klamath groups in a determined effort to bring about needed improvements on the highway linking the two communities.

Cooper scouted rumors that Lake county attitude toward the project has not been friendly. He cited the work done by the Lake county chamber to have additional sections of the road placed under federal aid, necessitating a bill which was put through congress, as ample evidence of Lakeview's good faith in behalf of the road.

Klamath county, Cooper said, could well work for lifting the unimproved sections of the highway on which a permanent grade has been established, and Lake county would battle for a new survey and grade through the Drew's valley, where this must be done before permanent surfacing can be installed.

BERRIES WITHHELD AT PORTLAND MART

PORTLAND, July 10. (UP)—Lured by the prospect of high prices from the canneries, farmers withheld the bulk of their berries from the eastside market today, while prices reached a new season high. Loganberries, heretofore not registering a consistent price, brought as high as \$1.40 a crate.

Youngberries ranged from \$1.75 to \$1.85. Blackcaps registered as high as \$2.00.

Raspberries in large quantity, demanded \$1.65-1.80.

Celery sold for \$1.85 per crate, while hearts brought \$1.00 per dozen.

Green beans 2 to 3c, wax beans 2 1/2 to 3c, and Oregon Giants 3 to 4c per pound.

Lettuce was strong with good grade selling \$5c to \$1.00.

Seattle cauliflower brought 90c per crate with no local showing.

Carrots, beets and cabbage remained unchanged. A few turnips brought 40-45c per dozen.

Crookneck and summer squash \$5 to 50c, while the Italian variety brought 20-25c.

Corn sold for 25-30c per dozen.

NEW YORK, July 10. (UP)—Trade movements showed few indications this week of following the usual seasonal course and kept close to former broadening tendencies, Dun & Bradstreet reported in their weekly review of trade and business.

In spite of further recessions in the drought-affected areas, the agency reported, hot weather was instrumental in bringing about a decided improvement in retail distribution. Gains were outstanding in wholesale branches, where fall buying opened officially, further stimulating the movement that got underway several weeks ago.

Industrial operations showed little change due to the moderate rebound following the holiday interruption, but continued to show substantial improvement over a year ago, the report stated.
