National and Local Markets

MARKET RECORDS TUMULTUOUS TRADE

CHICAGO, July 13. (AP)—After a day of tumultuous trading and seasonally wide fluctuations, grain markets today at the wind-up stood little altered from last week's latest level.

Forecasts of abatement of drought and heat were fulfilled but to a relatively slight extent, the promised relief seeming to have spent its force chiefly before reaching the grain belt proper. Rains in Canada were partly offset by official estimates that the 1936 Canadian wheat crop would be reduced to 275,000,000 bushels.

Wheat closed nervous, 1-1/4 under Saturday's finish, July 1934, Sept. 1.934-1.94; corn 1/2 down to 11 advanced, Sept. 812-82, Dec. 762-1; oats unchanged to 1 higher, and provisions varying from 17 cents setback to a rise of 2 cents.

Many issues edged forward into new high territory for the past 5 years or longer. There was some late profit taking, but the close was firm. Transfers were around 1,500,000 shares.

With showers appearing in some of the drought regions, agricultural implement, rail and merchandising stocks came to the fore in the morning. Most of the utilities, steels and motors were backward.

Among outstanding gainers were J. I. Case, International Harvester, Deere, Caterpillar Tractor, Oliver Farm, Southern Railway preferred, Santa Fe, Delaware and Hudson, Great Northern, Union Pacific, Atlantic Coast Line, Sears Roebuck, Montgomery Ward, Macy, Spengel-May Stern, Simmons, Chicago Mail Order, Douglas Aircraft, Union Carbide, American Smelting, Johns-Manville, U. S. Smelting, Greyhound Corp., Easton Mfg., and Woolworth. Electrical equipments orders were said to be at top levels for some time, and Westinghouse and General Electric were conspicuous in the forward move.

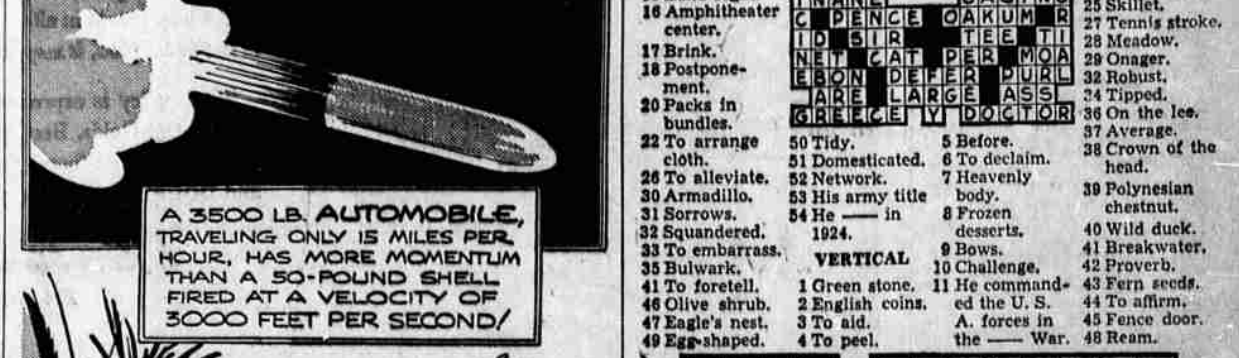
