## NEW PRICE MARK SET FOR GRAIN

CHICAGO, July 16. (AP)—Scorching temperatures expected to continue two days and doing widespread irreparable damage to corn, rushed that grain up the limit today, smashing season top price records.

Wheat soared about 3 1/2 cents at times owing to Canadian reports of rapidly augmenting injury to crops. Winnipeg prices, however, reacted sharply from advances, and wheat values here failed to hold well at top levels.

Corn closed buoyant, 4 1/2 cents above yesterday's finish, Sept. 87, Dec. 81 1/2; wheat nervous, 1 cent to 1 1/2 cents up, Sept. 1.02 1/2-1.06; Dec. 1.07-1.07 1/2; oats 5-1 1/2 advance, and provisions unchanged to a rise of 27 cents.

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## Stock Market Quotations

NEW YORK, July 16. (AP)—A number of specialties advanced quietly in today's stock market while profit-takers cashed in on some of the recent leaders.

Business and industrial news continued favorable, but the sharp advance through the seven consecutive sessions, sharply sold, attracted selling. The close was irregular. Transfers were around 1,450,000 shares.

Grains developed strength on estimates of drought damage and predictions of further severe heat in the crop districts. Farm implement and mail order stocks were consequently nervous.

Aviation issues pushed forward on reports of more orders from foreign as well as domestic sources, among these up 1 1/2 to 2 or more points were Douglas Aircraft, United Aircraft, Wright Aeronautical and Boeing.

Norfolk and Western yielded about 6 points.
