Has Blanks Printed—Circuit Judge Edward H. Ashurst, who recently started on a course of frequently waiving the three-day marriage requirement after a year and a half of denying waivers to virtually all applicants, has now had waiver blanks printed. It was learned at the courthouse Thursday. The printed forms make it possible for the judge to issue waivers in his chambers without making a trip downstairs to sign the marriage license book in the county clerk's office, as has been necessary in the past.

Recipe for perfect GRAPE JELLY

4 cups (2 lbs.) juice
7 1/2 cups (3 1/2 lbs.) sugar
1/4 bottle Certo

To prepare juice, stem about 3 pounds fully ripe grapes and crush thoroughly. Add 1/2 cup water, bring to a boil, cover, and simmer 10 minutes. Place fruit in jelly cloth or bag and squeeze out juice. (Concord grapes give best color and flavor. If Malaga or other tight-skinned grapes are used, use 3 1/2 cups juice; add 1/2 cup water and 1/2 cup lemon juice.) Measure sugar and juice into large saucepan and mix. Bring to a boil over hottest fire and at once add Certo, stirring constantly. Then bring to a full rolling boil and boil hard 1/2 minute. Remove from fire, skim, pour quickly. Paraffin at once. Makes about 11 glasses (8 fluid ounces each). All measurements are level.
