World Commerce Endangered
British shipping in the Straits of Gibraltar again was endangered by the weapons of civil war. The British liner Gibel, which escaped rebel air bombs by a narrow margin last week, today reported shells exploded close to her bows while she was passing two Spanish submarines.

Fascist soldiers who deserted into the leftist forces north of Madrid declared rebel troops were running short of food and described conditions in the insurgent camps as unbearable because of the stench of decomposing bodies.

Three hundred prisoners from Albacete arrived at Alicante under the escort of government guards. Some of the rebels were forced to take off their uniforms which crowds of spectators seized and tore to pieces.

The liberal forces were declared to be setting fire to pine woods through which they passed in an attempt to stem the rebel advance. Dense smoke from the blazing forests hung over the entire district.

A fascist broadcast at Seville said 1,300 wives and children of loyalist sailors were being held at Melilla. Spanish Morocco, "as hostages in case of a bombardment." Arrest of the hostages, the broadcast asserted, was ordered by Gen. Queipo de Llano, fascist commander.

England Captures Davis Cup Again

WIMBLEDON, Eng., July 28. (AP)—England won the Davis cup, prized trophy of the tennis world, for the fourth straight time today as Fred Perry vanquished the veteran Jack Crawford, 6-2, 6-3, 6-3, for the third and clinching victory over Australia. The final

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score of the five-match series was England 3, Australia 2. Perry's triumph came after Adrian Quist squandered the count at two-all with a 6-4, 3-6, 7-5, 6-3 win over England's dapper and usually machine-like H. W. (Bunny) Austin.

HARRISBURG, Pa., July 28. (AP)—Another shrieking crowd of jobless men and women scrambled into the galleries of the house and senate today, bent on the same picketing of the legislature which delayed adjournment of the senate two hours in the early morning.

"We want \$100,000,000 for relief and we're here to get it," they shouted. "We won't let our kids starve," women called down on the assembling senators.

ADDIS ABABA, July 28. (AP)—An Italian communique said today 1000 Ethiopians were killed and wounded in an unsuccessful attempt to cut the Addis Ababa-Dessale motor highway.

Veteran Congressman Trails In Election

ABILENE, Tex., July 28. (AP)—Thomas L. Blanton faced the fight of his political life today and blamed it on "insidious influence" and large sums of money "direct from Washington."

For the first time in the 20 years he has served as congressional representative of the 17th district, the Abilene campaigner found himself trailing in an election.

On the basis of returns from the Texas election bureau, Blanton was running behind Judge Clyde Garrett of Eastland, and will go into the primary run-off August 22. Garrett's margin last night, when the bureau closed was 22,613 to 18,136.

PLANE CREW DIES

CHARTRES, France, July 28. (AP)—Four members of the crew of a French bombing plane were killed today when the plane crashed near the village of Aulnay-Sous-Orneau. The pilot landed safely with a parachute.

Whether Alfred E. Smith will join the movement was uncertain Monday. He is on vacation and at his New York office it was said that "the meeting is not on his engagement book."

Colby to Attend
Smith, leader of the five democrats who sent a telegram to the Philadelphia democratic convention asking the delegates to repudiate President Roosevelt, has conferred recently with John D. M. Hamilton, republican national committee chairman.

Bainbridge Colby, secretary of state in the Wilson cabinet and

one of the signers of the Smith manifesto, said:
"I expect to be there, but I am not in position to say more at the moment."

Judge Daniel F. Cohalan, another signer of the telegram, will not be able to attend because he is in Europe and will not return until September. Reed and Ely, the other two signers, not only plan to attend but apparently will take an active part in the plans.
