Klamath Falls merchants' Trade and Win contest, launched last Saturday, already has gained momentum with over 200 candidates registered. Up to date those who have joined the contest are listed below. Campaigners are registered from not only Klamath Falls, but rural routes and outlying districts as well. Boys and girls residing outside of Klamath Falls are especially invited to join the race in which more than \$1400 in prizes are being offered.
