and that he was unable to see the oncoming car until too late to avoid the accident. He testified that he was traveling slowly, and that he signaled for the left turn.

Hutcherson, who is employed at the State Line Tavern, was en route to his evening's work when the accident occurred, and testified that he was traveling about 40 miles an hour as he approached the bridge, but that he slowed down as he neared the point.

He had never noticed the side road, he stated, and when he observed Hartshorn's machine approaching, it did not occur to him that it was going to turn across the highway. When Hutcherson realized that the car was turning, he swung his machine as far to the left as possible, but was unable to avoid the crash. Both machines were on the wrong sides of the road when the impact came.

Hits Head
Redmond, who had been given a ride by Hartshorn, was to have alighted at the intersecting road a few feet from where the accident occurred. He was thrown clear of the car, striking his head on the highway.

Officers testified that there was no trace of liquor on the

breath of either Hartshorn or Hutcherson.
Charles T. Organ, a passenger in the Hutcherson car, was also called to testify, but brought out no additional evidence relative to the fatal crash.
Definite identification of the dead man cannot be established until his fingerprints are compared with records at Washington, D. C.

Officers expect to hear from the government early in the week.

Setting a record smashing pace for Olympic decathlon competition, Bob Clark of San Francisco, former National A. A. U. titleholder, won two of the five events on today's all-around program, amassing 4194 points.
Clark captured the 100-meter sprint in 16.9 seconds, a record, and the broad jump with a record leap of 23 feet, and then turned in a fine 50-second performance in the 400-meter sprint.

Lehtinen Loses
Glenn Morris, Fort Collins, Colo., world record holder, won the 4000-meter dash in the sensational time of 49.4 seconds, bettering all previous decathlon records, and ended the first day with a total of 4192 points, right on Clark's heels.
Hoeckert of Finland captured the Olympic 5000-meter championship in record-breaking fashion.

Hoeckert lowered the Olympic standard of 14:30, made by his compatriot, Lauri Lehtinen in 1932, by 7.8 seconds, winning a gruelling race in 14:22.
Lehtinen, the defending champion, and John Henry Jonsson of Sweden, who finished second and third, also were clocked under the former Olympic record.
