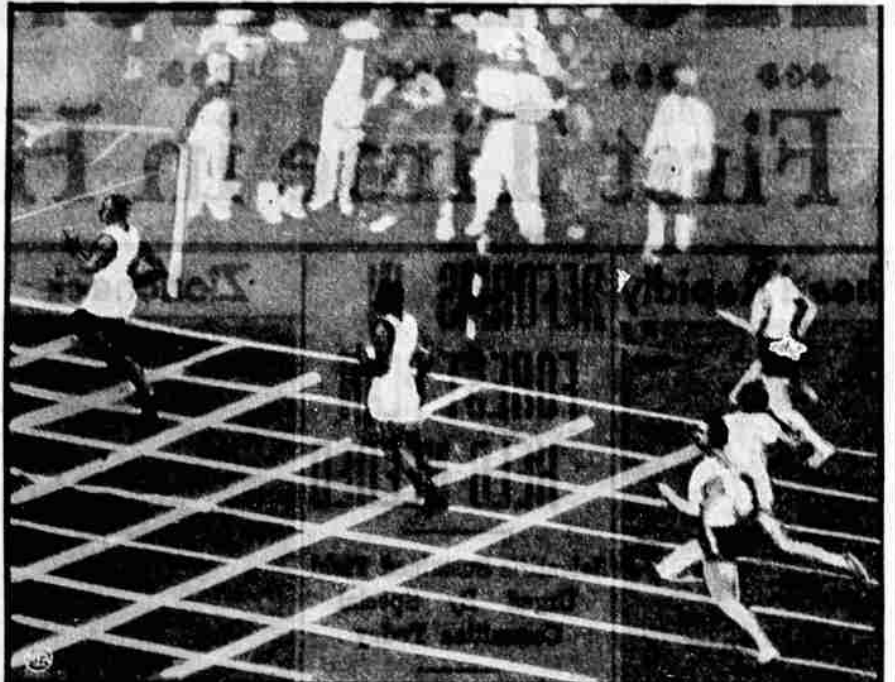

Fishing News

Diamond Lake: Fishing is good, with best results found by fishing deep with flashers and worms or by still fishing with worms.

Crescent Lake: Good-sized fish can be taken here by trolling, with also some fly fishing. The road into Crescent lake is in good condition.

Odell Lake: Fly fishing has been good, with some larger fish being caught on troll. This lake is reached by the Willamette highway, which is in good condition.

Crater Lake National Park: Fishing in Crater lake is still very good. Many good catches of silver-side and rainbow trout are being made on spinners and flies and on spinners with worms.

Rocky Point: Fishing here is consistently good and large-sized rainbow trout can be caught most any time on either spinners or wobblers.

Lake of the Woods: Fishing here is still just fair. A few good catches of silver-side are being made, mostly with flashers and worms, while bass are being taken on pike minnow plugs.

Fish Lake: Good fishing can still be found here for both eastern brook and silver-sides. Trolling with flashers and worms or still fishing with worms produce best results.

The North Fork of Sprague river is good for fly fishing, a blue upright or bucktail coachman being the favorite flies.

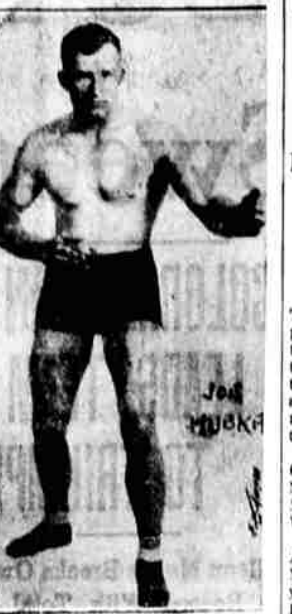
