PROCLAMATION
Whereas, The unregulated use of the following described areas, in my judgment, a menace to life and property due to the inflammable debris upon the ground, and also the inaccessibility of much of the territory because of the lack of roads and trails, and such unregulated use of said areas is unlawful:
All areas within the boundaries of the National Forests in Oregon, except the Siuslaw National Forest, and all timbered lands outside the National Forest boundaries adjacent to the Rogue River National Forest, lands in the Jenny Creek Watershed north of the Ashland-Klamath Falls Highway and west of the Jenny Creek Road in T. 38, R. 39 and 40 S., R. 3 and 4 E.
Therefore, I, Charles H. Martin, Governor of the State of Oregon, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the provisions of Chapter 279, Oregon Laws 1933, do hereby close said areas and the same shall be subject to use only upon condition that entrants shall comply with all of the following requirements or conditions:
1.—To refrain from smoking while traveling in such areas, except on paved or surfaced highways.
2.—To secure permits issued by the forester or a fire warden before building a camp fire other than at improved, designated and posted camp grounds on such areas.
3.—To have as a part of his or her equipment when using camp fires, except when traveling as a pedestrian, and/or camping at improved, designated and posted

CANADIAN CROP REPORTED DOWN

CHICAGO, Aug. 8 (AP)—Late advances of wheat prices today followed word that the Canadian government reported Canada's wheat crop condition as only 45 per cent of normal.

The Canadian crop report came just before trading here was ended for the day, and said the past month had been one of the most disastrous on record in the prairie provinces. For both Saskatchewan and Alberta, the condition figures on wheat were the lowest in 23 years.

Wheat closed unsettled 1/4-1/2 above yesterday's finish, Sept. 1.12 1/4-1/2, Dec. 1.11 1/4-1/2; corn 1/2 off to 3/4 up, Sept. 1.04 1/2-1/2, Dec. 93 1/4-1/2; oats at 1/4 decline to 1/2 advance, and provisions 5 to 7 cents down.

PORTLAND, Aug. 8 (AP)—Pressure appeared in the Portland wheat futures market today but September restated it, gained 1/4, while December remained unchanged and May was 1/4 higher. Sales included 3000 bushels of May. On the simple cash market, advances of 2 to 2 1/2 c occurred.
