

### HOUSING SHORTAGE IN OREGON CITED

HALEM, Aug. 21 (UP)—Emigration to Oregon from the drought areas of the middle west has caused the greatest housing shortage in recent years, according to Hugh H. Earle, state real estate commissioner.

Earle advocated immediate consideration of a home building program to meet the emergency. Returning property, he said, has ended the doubling-up of families and intensified the demand for houses. "Children aren't living with the old folks any more," the commissioner said. "The younger married people who came back home during the depression want places of their own now. And in addition we hear every day of new families here from the middle west who want places to live."

With the real estate business the best it has been since 1928, more agents than ever before have been licensed by the state, Earle said. Demand is heavy for small acreages.

Realtors expect the state to gain 100,000 population from the parched middle west, according to reports to the commissioner.

The commissioner pointed to sales by the state land board and the World War veterans' state aid commission as evidence of the boom market for real estate.

"Traveling around the state, too, it's evident that farms are being improved," Earle said. "Everywhere I have seen new barns being built, new chicken houses going up, new fences, new roofs and paint."

### Mexico Shipping War Supplies to Loyalist Forces

MEXICO CITY, Aug. 21 (UP)—Practical aid for the Spanish government in its struggle against fascist rebels appeared assured today with shipment from Mexico City for Vera Cruz of more than 20 carloads of war material reliably reported to be destined for Spain's left wing forces.

The shipment reportedly included 50,000 rifles. This correspondent witnessed departure of the train in a driving rain. The cars carried special bills of lading marked "military service" and it was understood the shipment was to be given right of way over all other traffic. At Vera Cruz the arms and ammunition reportedly were to be loaded aboard the Spanish steamer Marcellana for direct

shipment to Valencia or Barcelona.

Informants told the United Press the shipment was in part payment of gunboats and cruisers constructed in Spanish shipyards for the Mexican government. Officials maintained a discreet silence regarding the shipment, however, and it was understood instructions were issued not to discuss it.

The war department said it was unaware of the shipment while the Spanish embassy declined all comment and would neither confirm nor deny the arms had been sent.

Mexican sympathies with the Spanish government have been very pronounced since outbreak of the civil war a month ago. It is feared a fascist victory in Spain would encourage similar groups in Mexico to overthrow the Cardenas administration.

### NEWSPAPER MAN FORESEES CARNAGE

NEW YORK, Aug. 21 (UP)—Returning from front-line coverage of the battlefields in Ethiopia and the scenes of rioting in Palestine, Edwin J. Nell, Associated Press staff reporter, arrived today on the liner Conte di Savoia, envisioning a continuing Italian campaign of aggression.

"Italy, spurred by her African conquests," Nell said, "is looking to broader conquests. Some of her high officers told me that conquering of Ethiopia is only the beginning of a plan for an unlimited empire."

Palestine, Nell said, "is a maelstrom," but it is unlike the "mad, militaristic front I saw in Ethiopia."

### Aged Tourist Dies on Coast Highway

Foster, 74, of Los Angeles, was killed instantly and his wife, 54, critically injured when their automobile plunged off a 50-foot embankment on the Oregon coast highway near here.
