ADDITION MADE TO SLAUGHTER HOUSE

MALIN, Aug. 27.—Work is under way on a building program at the A. Kallina slaughter house, located one-half mile north of town, with the addition of a 12 by 28 structure to be used as a hot water room. When the addition is completed, a water heater is to be installed and other equipment added.

With the building and installation of a new refrigeration room scheduled for the near future, the plant will be one of the most complete and up-to-date in Klamath county. Present changes are being made at an estimated cost of \$2000. The original building was erected about 15 years ago.

Construction work is being done by Elmore of Malin and Andrew Kuehne, Merrill. Work will be completed in a week or 10 days.

"We are on the verge of momentous events," Stalin said, according to the London newspaper. "Our enemies are getting into position, so be ready."

"Comrades of the red forces! At any moment now you may be called upon to lay down your lives in defense of your proletarian birthplace."

Plane Brings Human Bones Out of Arctic

FAIRBANKS, Alaska, Aug. 26 (UP)—A Pollack Flying Service plane landed at Fairbanks tonight, bringing out of the mountainous wilderness north of here charred bones of four victims of a crash over a year ago.

Remains were those of Pilot Arthur Hines, Alton Nordale, federal court clerk and member of the Alaskan legislature, John Long, Fairbanks business man, formerly of Toledo, Ohio, and Lona's bride of two months.

Victorious looking lions and tigers will snarl and snap at him as he moves about through the sawdust, a chair and pistol in his left hand, and a whip in the right.

The young man will be Clyde Beatty, the world's greatest and most fearless wild animal trainer, with the Cole Bros.-Clyde Beatty circus, coming to Klamath Falls Saturday, for performance, afternoon and night at the South Sixth street circus grounds.

He will be the same Beatty who was ripped and torn by one of the beasts less than a year ago, and previous to that, at the show's winter quarters and on the road, when death seemed inevitable each time. The plucky youth has lived to carry on his death-defying vocation—the training of the most treacherous beasts that breathe.

There will be 40 ferocious, jungle-born lions and tigers in the arena at one time—the most ever attempted by a trainer. It is said to be the most thrilling wild animal display in history. The gigantic show, traveling on three circus special trains will bring scores of features in addition to the fearless Beatty, and many of them will be new to circus fans.

Performances will be given at 2 and 8 p. m., with the main gates opening one hour earlier in each instance allowing leisurely inspection of the huge double-menagerie which features "Jumbo the 2nd," the only African elephant with a circus in this country.

An old-fashioned circus street parade show day morning is another show day event. It is said to be the largest circus parade in history.

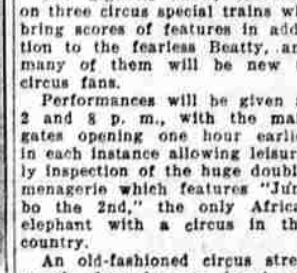
