air attack on the capital in two days.

Two thousand militiamen of the Madrid government comprised the surprise attackers moving on Burgos. They were reported near Briviesca, less than 25 miles away, and General Emilio Mola, northern insurgent commander, moved his forces into position to withstand the onslaught.

Meanwhile, French newspapers quoted refugees from Spain today as saying 100 fascist rebels, many of them formerly high in the Spanish government, were executed in Madrid as a reprisal for an attempt to burn a jail where fascist prisoners were held.

Extremists Kill

Rebel radio broadcasts declared the position of the government in Madrid was becoming precarious, and that extremists were killing hundreds of persons in the capital. The radio station at Jerez de la Frontera, near Cadiz, announced

"a Madrid personality, now in T. Juan, Spanish Morocco, declared that in two nights the Marxists killed 2000 persons in Madrid."

With machine gun bullets spattering French soil, a single rebel scouting plane routed two big government bombers in the battle area near Irua and San Sebastian, on the Bay of Biscay.

Murphy is campaigning for the democratic nomination for governor of Michigan.

"I have no interest in any

other public office and am not a candidate for any," he said.

NEW YORK, Aug. 28 (AP)—Approached today on the question of President Roosevelt's appointing him secretary of war to succeed the late George H. Dern, Mayor Fiorello La Guardia said:

"I have a contract with the people of the city of New York until December, 1937, subject to renewal, optional with both sides."

The association adopted a resolution submitted by the committee on jurisprudence and law reform disapproving all bills and amendments to the constitution, the effect of which would limit the jurisdiction or abridge the powers of any federal court.

CCC boys were attempting to throw up a temporary dike at one place, and to strengthen the dike between Haskins and Kandra holdings.

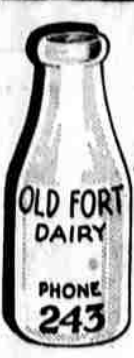
Car Overtakes on Riverside Today
