GERMANS WIN WARM PRAISE

Olympic Athletes Laud Handling of Games At Berlin

By ALAN GOULD Associated Press Sports Editor NEW YORK, Aug. 29 (AP)—Beside bringing home an assortment of trophies, differences of opinion and the ingredients for an old-fashioned family row over the athletic management, America's returning Olympic forces are pretty well agreed on two post-mortem topics of debate.

An Associated Press poll of the official party which arrived on the President Roosevelt, comprising more than half the entire Olympic delegation, clearly indicated: (1) That Germany's extraordinary efficiency, showmanship and mass spectacular demonstration combined to furnish the most striking general feature of the games; and, (2) That the palm for individual achievement, in any sport, unquestionably belongs to the great Jesse Owens, winner of four medals.

The poll among nearly 50 leaders and observers revealed Owens as the choice of 21; Jack Lovelock, 1500 meter champion, and Glen Morris, the decathlon winner, tied for second place with 12 votes apiece; Forrest Towns, high hurdling king, and Jack Medina, 400 meter swimming champion, were the only others picked, each receiving two votes.
