Grain Values Recover

CORN BENEFITS BY SHARP RALLY

CHICAGO, Aug. 29 (AP)—A sharp rally of corn prices that carried the market at one stage two cents over the previous close today featured the recovery of grain values after yesterday's break.

September corn rose as much as 34 cents from early lows but then reacted and closed at a net fractional loss for the session. Other corn futures and wheat finished higher, however.

In some quarters belief was expressed the possible effect of Argentine corn importations had been exaggerated so far as availability of that grain for delivery on September contracts here was concerned.

Corn closed 8 off to 11 higher. September 1.04-1. December 92-94, and wheat was 1-11 up. September 1.09-1. December 1.08-09. Oats gained 4-8, rye 4-1, and barley lost 2-4. Provisions closed with a range of 3 cents off to 5 cents higher.
