

Coast Conference Football Practice Starts

LIGHT DRILLS FIRST ORDER

Pre-Season Survey Indicates Washington As Team to Beat.

SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 10 (AP)—College football players begin punting, passing and packing the pigskin in earnest today, as practice opens at 10 Pacific Coast conference schools, and others "frozen out" by the eight-team round robin.

Tackling and signal drills will be the chief business for a week or so before contact work in scrimmages and practice games. The first conference game is September 26, when Oregon State plays University of Southern California at Los Angeles.

University of Washington has already been selected as "the team to beat," because of an impressive bunch of returning veterans. Other schools gifted with vets include University of California at Los Angeles and University of Stanford.

Stanford, Coast champion the past three seasons, is the "dark horse," through loss of 16 veterans, among them the "Vow boys," who kept Stanford at the top.

University of California, like Stanford, unfavored with returning material, boasts several good backfield men, including speedy Floyd Blower, one of the Coast's finest passers. Veterans Bob Herwig, center; Ward Stockton, tackle; and Bob Gilbert, guard, are back to bolster the line.

University of Southern California opens with one of the most encouraging prospects since the time of Trojan supremacy. A large turnout includes heavy linemen and a light, fast backfield. As at Washington State college, the Trojan ranks contain good sophomore material.

While California, Stanford, U. S. C., Washington, Washington State, U. C. L. A., Oregon and Oregon State play each other in the eight-team round-robin schedule, Idaho and Montana, the conference teams "frozen out," play independent programs, in which they have managed to squeeze in a few games with conference teams.

Klamath Falls will see college football again this fall. That much became certain Thursday with announcement by the Junior Chamber of Commerce, sponsor, that Coach Jean Eberhart's Southern Oregon Normal eleven had arranged to meet the Oregon State Rooks on Modoc field, Friday night, October 16.

It is something of a tradition that the Sons schedule one of their games each season for this city which otherwise is isolated so far as college sports are concerned, and Klamath's football-hungry fans will welcome the return of the Ashland outfit with enthusiasm.
