

Top marks were whittled down in the final hour when General Motors announced salary cuts ranging from 10 to 30 per cent for some 40,000 "white collar" employes, blaming the action on continuance of the recession and its effect on automotive distribution.

There was a delayed opening of more than 10 minutes in Chrysler which, on a block of 3000 shares, showed a decline of 22 points. The loss was subsequently reduced
