GROCERIES WARNED TO PROTECT FOODS

Grocery stores in Klamath Falls have been warned by Henry Schortgen, member of the police department, to protect all fresh fruits, vegetables and candy from contamination by dust and insects.

"Foods in the process of manufacture, preparation, packing, storing, sale, distribution or transportation must be securely protected from flies, dust and, as far as may be necessary, by all reasonable means from all foreign or injurious contamination. The sidewalk display of foods is prohibited unless such products are enclosed in a showcase or similar device which will protect the same from flies, dust or other contamination; provided, that food products other than fish, meat and meat products, that necessarily have to be peeled, pared or cooked before they are fit for consumption, may be displayed provided that the bottom of the container be at least 18 inches above the surface of the walk."

PARK CARETAKER TAKES YOUTHS INTO CUSTODY

Three Klamath Falls boys were taken to the police sergeant's shortly after 3 o'clock Tuesday afternoon by E. E. Spencer, Moore parkkeeper. Spencer complained that the youths had damaged play equipment at the park. The boys were released and the problem referred to Helen McCarter, juvenile officer.
