

EXPERT EXPLAINS STRAWBERRY CARE

The period following strawberry harvest is just about as important to the plants as before harvest, according to information contained in a new OSC extension circular 328, entitled, "After Harvest Care of Strawberry Plants."

This mimeographed circular, written by O. T. McWhorter, extension horticulturist, and William P. Cyrus, county agricultural agent of Washington county, gives detailed information on the care of a strawberry patch to protect it against insects and diseases and to insure the kind of development needed to bring most profitable future crops. Fruit bud formation in the single crop strawberry is believed to take place largely following harvest and until late fall.

Information contained in the circular includes suggestions regarding cultivation, results to be expected from fertilizers, irrigation of strawberry fields, elimination of crinkle diseases and strawberry crown moth. Copies may be had free from county agents in strawberry producing counties.

G. N. COMPLETES THREE-MILE SPUR

MALIN, July 14—The three-mile spur built by the Great Northern to Alnsea butte, also known as East Sand Butte, 24 miles southeast of Malin was completed about July 1 and cinders from the butte are now being taken out for ballasting of the roadbed. A variety of color in the cinders has been found with the color range including red, yellow, black and green, according to the crew that is moving the earth.

Approximately 2000 yards has been moved to date.

Chopped Beef Cutlets
(Serves 4)
One tablespoon chopped onion, salt, pepper, 1 cup fresh bread crumbs, 1 egg, slightly beaten, 1 cup milk.

Saute onion in butter. Add to chopped steak. Add salt, pepper, crumbs, egg and milk. Mix well. Shape into 6 cutlets. Broil in hot skillet 10 minutes, turning carefully to brown on both sides. Serve at once on cutlet-shaped pieces of toast or buttered rolls. Garnish with sprigs of parsley.

Watercress Sandwiches
Watercress sandwiches always taste refreshing at picnics with broiled or fried meats. Make them just before you leave the house. Use thin slices of bread, evenly buttered, and sprigs of watercress, chilled and delicately seasoned with salt and pepper. Fold between slices of bread, but do not press down too hard. Do not use mayonnaise if you want the watercress to keep fresh.
