

TEN KLAMATH COUNTY NAMES IN PLAY CAST

ASHLAND — The Oregon Shakespearean Festival association troupe, which will present its fifth annual repertoire of plays at Ashland from August 4 to 13, includes many young actors from Klamath county. As in the past, Klamath county has had many representatives in the Shakespearean drama, and this year it has the honor to claim the beautiful queen of the festival, Miss Lillian Davis, whose role of Queen Elizabeth has taken her to rule Treasure Island on Ashland day, and has given the festival nationwide prominence. As well as being "theme girl," Miss Davis plays the part of Luciana in "Comedy of Errors," a priest in "Hamlet," and the player queen in "Hamlet."

Robert Perkins has a heavy part in his portrayal of four roles: first merchant in "Comedy of Errors," a priest in "Hamlet," Hortensio in "Taming of the Shrew," and Corin Le Beau in "As You Like It." Both Perkins and Miss Davis won scholarships to the Southern Oregon College of Education for their outstanding work in Shakespeare.

Duane Monroe, also of Klamath county, plays more parts than anyone in the cast, taking seven roles. Of chief importance are his roles in "Hamlet," where he plays Francisco, first player, player king, and Fortinbras. He also plays a lord in "Taming of the Shrew," and a minor part in "As You Like It."

Bob Stedman has been with the festival company ever since its inception in 1935. He plays the leading role in "Taming of the Shrew," Petruchio. Stedman also plays the part of Touchstone in "As You Like It," and Bernardo, Lucianus, and a player in "Hamlet." He is also technical director, and, as such, has charge of construction, lighting, sound and grounds.

In the technical department, Klamath county also finds many of its citizens. Mrs. Marcela Rowe is the wardrobe mistress. Her experience in such work dates back to the last festival season, when she was also in the same department. Miss Mary Pat Rowe, Miss Louise Logan, and Miss Helen Lois Wainwright are seamstresses in the costume department. There are two office girls, both from Klamath Falls, Miss Lynn Beals and Miss Nan Goeller.

Rehearsals of the play are progressing rapidly, with both afternoon and evening practices. "The Taming of the Shrew" has been presented in public twice, in San Francisco and Ashland, and also in a radio program over station KPO. Tickets are now available at the Klamath county chamber of commerce and Shaw Stationery company in Klamath Falls, or at the Ashland Shakespearean office in Ashland.

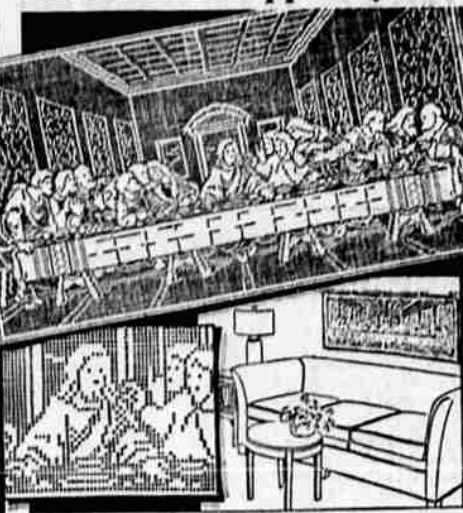

200 at Antelope Conclave on Lake County Mountain

Klamath members of the famed Order of the Antelope were drifting into town from their home range Monday afternoon, browned and dusty from two days spent in the great open spaces.

About 30 local men made the trip to Hart mountain, in eastern Lake county, where the Antelope convention is held annually in a grove beside a mountain stream. Altogether, attendance at the convention reached a record of 200.

Klamath contributed a large number of men to the class of candidates, which assumed the "wild jackass" degree Sunday night at campfire ceremonies. Henry Semon, chief white tail of the order for the past year, presided, and conducted the ceremony with the aid of Hurl Snyder of Lakeview, Henry Fowler of Bend, and Rodney Keating of Portland.

About 100 new members were taken into the order, which was started nine years ago to foster public interest in the Hart mountain refuge and its wildlife. Two Klamath county officials, Sheriff Lloyd Low and Assessor Charles H. Mack were among the candidates this year, while Police Judge Carl Cook and Policeman Fred Olin provided musical entertainment, and also became full-fledged members.

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PROFIT TAKERS HALT ADVANCE IN STOCK BIDS

NEW YORK, July 24 (AP) — Stock market industrialists tipped backward fractions to more than a point in today's market as profit taking on the recent strong recovery more than offset quiet buying of utilities and specialties.

Dealings attained a fair degree of speed in the forenoon, but slackened appreciably after midday. Transfers, however, were around the 1,000,000-share mark. Extreme losses were reduced in many cases at the close, although steel, motors and rubbers continued under water.

Brokers' quarters, on the whole, thought it natural the list should enjoy a breathing spell in view of the fact the rally of the last week or so had shot numerous issues to new peaks for the year on volumes several times those of the lethargic proceedings of the past two months.
