

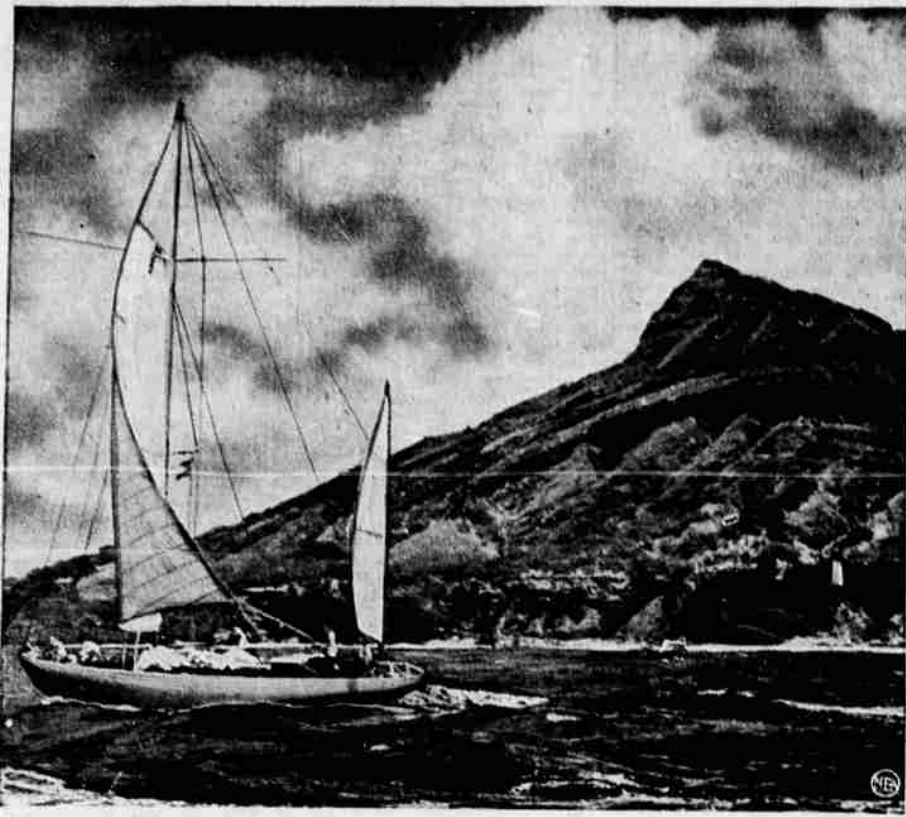

Macs Map McNutt's Future



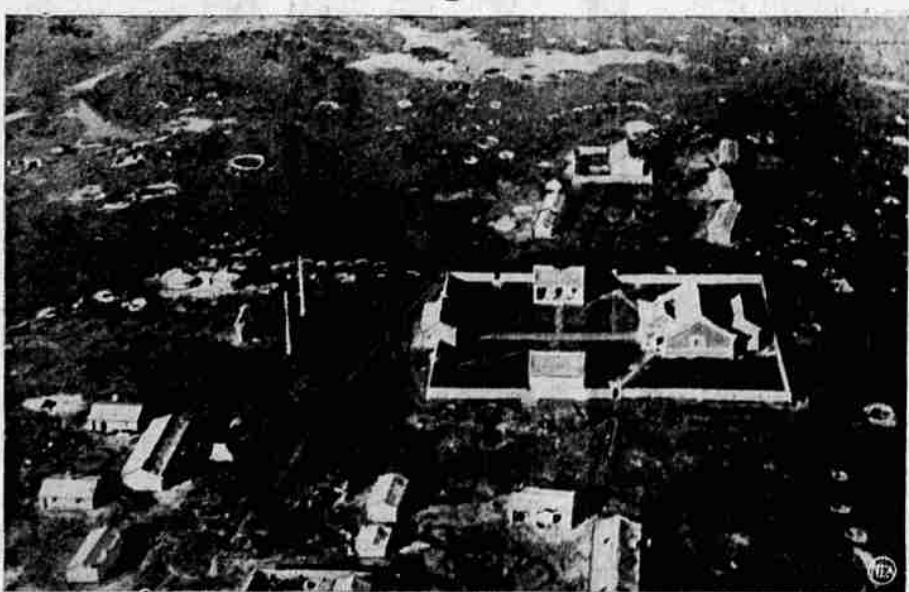

Soviet Bombs Blast Huge Craters Near Border



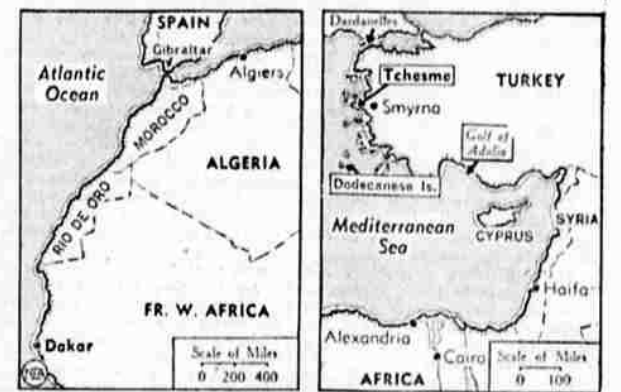
Bombing by Soviet-Outer Mongolian warplanes blasted these great holes in the fields around Kanchurmia, near the Mongolian-Manchukuo border.

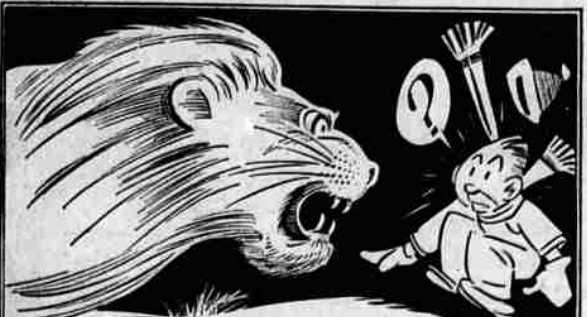
French and British Weld Defense



Maps show where French and British plan to co-ordinate defense on west coast of Africa and Turkish coast. Dakar, location of which is shown at left, is chief port of French Senegal. Here fleets of both nations will establish center of operations for patrolling south Atlantic. Tchesme, right, will be fortified under agreement with Turkey. Of great strategic importance because it lies between Italian Dodecanese Islands and Dardanelles, Tchesme will become main base of operations for Turkish, French, and British air and sea forces. In addition, Turkey will construct fortified line along west coast from Smyrna to Gulf of Adalia.
