

LEADERS UNDER POLICE GUARD AFTER BOMBING

LONDON, July 27 (AP)—Scotland yard put Prime Minister Chamberlain and other cabinet members under special guard today, held three men for examination and questioned scores in a search for terrorists following yesterday's series of five bombings.

The explosions, in which one life was lost, occurred at the house of commons adopted drastic measures to combat the outlawed Irish republican army.

Extraordinary precautions were in force today at all railroad stations, including two where bombings occurred in the last 24 hours.

The house of parliament and the British museum were the objects of closest scrutiny.

Afternoon newspapers said Scotland Yard was looking for "a man with a slouch" who was believed seen yesterday at Kings Cross station just before the explosion there with one and perhaps two companions.

Chamberlain told the house of commons "no effort will be spared to bring to justice those who are guilty of these criminal and cowardly attacks"—yesterday's bombings.

Lord Stanhope, first lord of the admiralty, announced the bill to assist suppression of the I.R.A., passed last night by commons, would be expedited through the house of lords so it could receive the king's approval and become law tomorrow.

Police announced 75 attacks of gellignite—the explosive used in most of the bombings—had been found attached to a pylon carrying electricity supply lines at a town near Liverpool. An alarm clock attached to the explosive and timed to go off at 1 p. m. was discovered by a farm worker at 11 a. m.

During the commons debate Chamberlain did not reply when Sir Thomas Moore, conservative, interposed:

"Will the prime minister now consider the application of flogging for such dastardly crimes?"

Five men were seized for questioning in London and one in Liverpool, but authorities said none was being detained on specific charges.

The most serious bombing yesterday was at busy Kings Cross station, where Donald Campbell, Edinburgh university lecturer on his way home from a Paris honeymoon with his bride of a few months, lost his life. Mrs. Campbell was injured seriously. In all, fifteen were injured there and five at Victoria station in a later explosion. Both explosions occurred in cloakrooms where parcels were checked.

HAWKINS UP FOR NEW 4-YEAR TERM

WASHINGTON, July 27 (AP)—The president sent to the senate today for confirmation this postmaster nomination:

Oregon: Klamath Falls, Burt E. Hawkins.

Postmaster Burt Hawkins took office for a four-year term in June, 1935. If the senate confirms his new nomination, he will enter a term ending in 1943.

Hawkins is a pioneer Klamath county democrat and former sheriff.

Vacationists Gather Bottles Of Treasure on Sea Beaches

ROCKAWAY, Ore., July 27—Vacationists to north Tillamook county beaches this year are deriving much pleasure and profit from searching the shoreline of the Pacific for treasure-bearing bottles, cast overboard in large quantities on the incoming tide every other Sunday morning throughout the year by the North Tillamook County Sea Treasure association, an organization of business men who are taking this means of providing their guests with wholesome recreation augmented by suitable reward.

The association calculates that more than \$2000 will be given away in the course of the year in the form of merchandise orders including everything from groceries to hardware, and orders entitling the finder to free meals at restaurants, free lodging in north Tillamook county's finest motor courts and cottage groups, free horseback rides, free dances, many other miscellaneous services and prizes, and even cash awards.

No charge is made for entering into the fun. Finders are keepers and no limit is set to the number of prizes one person may find and redeem. One youthful visitor from a neighboring county picked up in one day \$20 worth of prizes on a single stretch of beach, and his exploit attracted so much attention in his home town that the communities around which his activities entered have found themselves hosts to many carloads of people from that locality, there to try their own luck with treasure trove.

At the same time hidden currents of the great Pacific have been carrying the hunt into more distant fields. Although many of the bottles cast overboard find their way to shore within a few hours along the north Tillamook county beaches, and most have been beached within two or three days, there are still many missing bottles even from the first lot cast afloat June 24, and it is expected that they will be heard from later.

To date the long distance record has been set by one bottle which was picked up July 4, four miles south of Florence, by Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Plattner of Gardiner.

The next consignments of bottles containing awards will be released at a point beyond the breakers on Sunday morning, August 6.

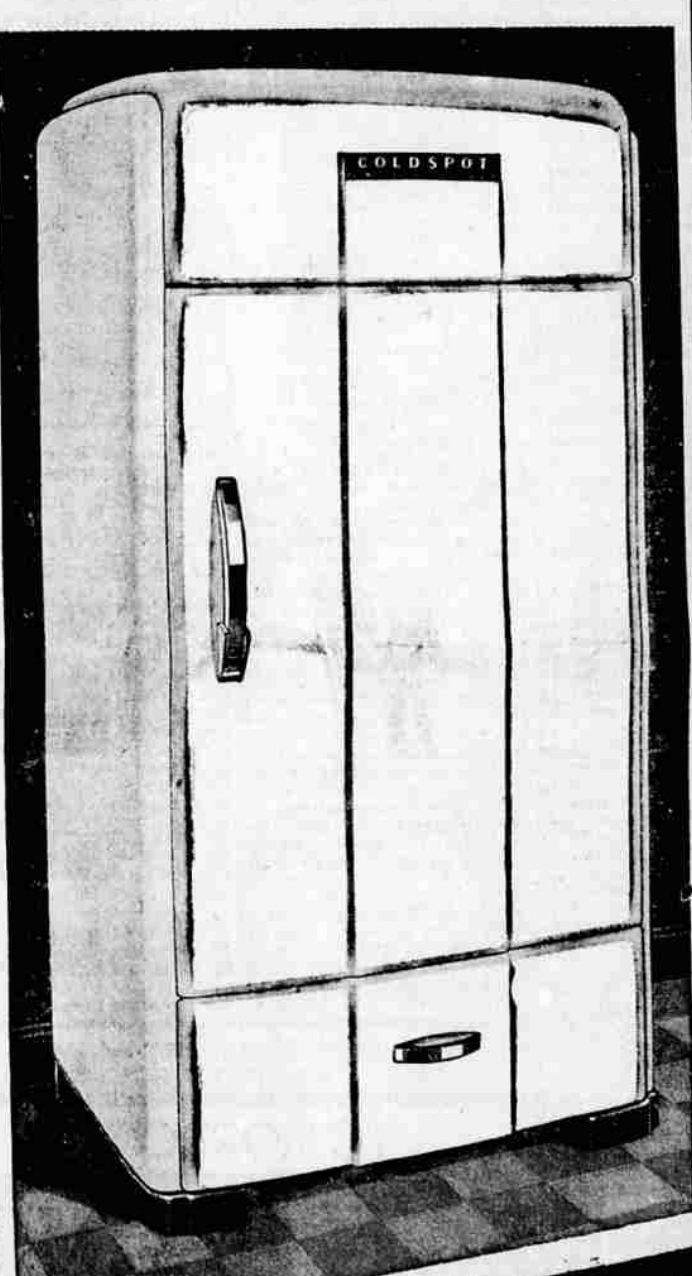

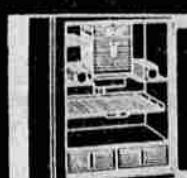
