CHANCES OF PEACE BOOST STOCK LIST

NEW YORK, AUG. 25 (AP)—Wall Street saw faint chances of at least a momentary European peace today and traders bid up stock market favorites 1 to 4 points at the best.

U. S. government securities, weak at one time, came back substantially, as did many corporate issues. Foreign dollar bonds, however, kept going down.

The stock list loafed throughout the greater part of the proceedings but picked up momentum in the fourth hour's upturn. Shares approximated 750,000. Final prices were under the tops in the majority of cases.

Prominent gainers included U. S. Steel, Bethlehem, General Motors, Anaconda, Kennecott, American Smelting, Du Pont, Allied Chemical, U. S. Rubber and Douglas Aircraft.

WAR SCARE BRINGS SLUMP FOR WHEAT

CHICAGO, AUG. 25 (AP)—Europe's hesitancy on the brink of war upset wheat prices in leading North American markets today, causing a sharp slump that eliminated much of the gains registered during this week's war scare.

Chicago wheat tumbled more than two cents a bushel while losses at Winnipeg amounted to more than 4 cents. Some of the selling was credited to foreign interests offsetting purchases abroad.

AGENTS WILL MAKE TESTS FOR WEEVIL

SALEM, Ore., Aug. 25 (UP)—The state department of agriculture in cooperation with Oregon State college, the federal government and local interests in Baker county will conduct an experiment in methol bromide fumigation for alfalfa weevil.

Frank McKennon, chief of the division of plant industry in the state department, lately returned from California where he observed a similar study which proved 100 per cent successful insofar as fumigation in refrigerator cars or under rubberized canvas went.

The Baker county experiment will be conducted in "reefers" furnished by the Union Pacific railroad and will continue until cold weather sets in. The United States bureau of entomology and plant quarantine will provide a man to make the checks of the experiment.

McKennon said the dosage in the California experiment was one pound of methol bromide to 1000 cubic feet of space. This is kept up for 24 hours, although kills have been secured under high temperatures in as short a time as six hours.

If the experiment is successful it will mean that growers in Malheur, Baker, Union, Harney, Josephine, Jackson and Douglas counties, where a quarantine preventing out-of-state shipment now exists, will be able to market their alfalfa hay without difficulty.
