STOCKS RISE AFTER EARLY DEPRESSION

NEW YORK, Aug. 28 (AP)—Under the leadership of steel and motors, stocks rallied steadily in today's market after an early tumble of 1 to 4 points attributed mainly to a revival of European war tension. Prices began to improve around mid-day and, in late dealings, extreme losses were reduced in many instances or converted into modest advances. Most closing quotations, however, were on the outside, recoveries giving away here and there at the finish. Transfers for the five hours approximated 700,000 shares. The feeling in the boardrooms was that war or peace would be decided probably with the space of hours. Prominent shares in the resistant class were Chrysler, General Motors, U. S. Steel, Bethlehem and Standard Oil of N. J. Inclined to lag were Montgomery Ward, Sears Roebuck, Douglas Aircraft, Anaconda, American Can and American Telephone. Bonds, especially U. S. governments and a number of foreign loans, were heavy. Commodities were mixed. Today's closing quotations:

PRICES RETREAT ON GRAIN MARKET

CHICAGO, Aug. 28 (AP)—Although the war scare continued to keep the grain market in turmoil today, sellers assumed leadership much of the session and prices retreated sharply from early gains of 2 1/2 to 3 cents a bushel. Just before the close all but 1-1/4 cents of the early strong advance was wiped out but the market stood at this level.

Uncertainty regarding outcome of the crisis in Europe was the most unsettling market factor. Some traders expressed surprise government loans on 1939 wheat up to August 23 totaled no more than 57,500,000 bushels. Wheat closed 2-1/4 cents higher than Saturday.
