

MOBILE SPUD VAMP SET UP IN SOUTHEAST

Establishment of a mobile camp at Merrill for the duration of the spud harvest is now underway. The camp has 200 family units. It is a tent frame community, and the purpose is to take people out of ditch bank and roadside camps. Electric lights and sanitation facilities are provided. A charge of ten cents per each family unit per day is made, the money to be used for the benefit of the camp. The location is at the edge of Merrill opposite the Great Northern depot.

The Farm Security administration is establishing the camp. It is the only kind in the west.

The Oregon employment service will have offices at Merrill. Farmers wishing to employ potato help can obtain service at the Merrill office.

Popcorn Works Well on Your Menu For Labor Day

Open house, either at your end of the trail, or at your journey's end, is in keeping with the long Labor day weekend.

Popcorn balls, great stacks of them, make a sweet welcome. And a gala cake is always part of American hospitality. If you go on a camping trip, or visit friends, popcorn balls and this sumptuous cake will make your picnic or your welcome even better.

Popcorn Balls

(makes 36)

Three quarts popped corn, 2-3 cup New Orleans molasses, 1 1/2 cups sugar, 1-3 teaspoon vinegar, 1-3 teaspoon salt, 2 tablespoons butter, 2 teaspoons vanilla, 1 cup water.

Pick over popped corn, discarding all hard kernels. Boil molasses, sugar, water, vinegar and salt without stirring, to 270 degrees

F., or until it becomes brittle when tried in cold water. Remove from fire and add butter and vanilla. Have corn in a large pan, pour the syrup over it gradually, using a spoon to mix well. Form into balls and wrap in wax paper when cool.

Brazil Nut Spice Cake

One-half cup shortening, 1 cup sugar, 2 well beaten eggs, 1 cup finely chopped Brazil nuts, 1 cup strong coffee, 1 1/2 cups sifted cake flour, 2 1/2 teaspoons baking powder, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon, 1/2 teaspoon cloves, 1/2 teaspoon ginger.

Cream shortening, add sugar gradually and cream well. Add well-beaten eggs and beat together until rich and puffy with air. Stir in the chopped Brazil nuts. Sift together flour, baking powder, salt and spices. Add these sifted dry ingredients to cake

mixture alternately with the liquid coffee. Bake in two 8-inch layer pans (greased and lined with waxed paper) in moderate oven (350 degrees F.) about 35 minutes. Cool and frost as desired, decorating top of cake with sliced Brazil nuts.

RECRUITING WORK SPEEDED BY ARMY, NAVY CAMPAIGNS

WASHINGTON, Sept. 7 (AP)—Officials disclosed today army and navy recruiting campaigns had been accelerated to keep pace with demands of neutrality enforcement.

The navy plans to enlist in short order an additional 5,000 men authorized by congress, instead of adding them gradually over a 12 month period, it was indicated.

Additional men were demanded by the Atlantic coast patrol which started yesterday, the operation of long-lie destroyers, and President Roosevelt's decision, that warship crews should be at full peace strength.

Reinforcement of the Panama canal garrison months ahead of schedule has accelerated the army's record peace time undertaking to recruit nearly 115,000 men as additions and replacements by next mid-year.

The army's drive was reported well ahead of schedule. The navy has a waiting list of more than 10,000 qualified applicants. At the start of the fiscal year on July 1, the navy had 110,000

BUICK ANNOUNCES CUT IN PRICES, TWO NEW MODELS

PLANT, Mich., Sept. 7 (AP)—Parlow H. Curtice, president and general manager of Buick division of General Motors Corporation, announced today price reductions ranging from \$17, to \$281 on nine 1940 models.

The 1940 price range will be from \$895 for a business coupe of 121-inch wheelbase to \$2,299 for a limousine.

Prices, Curtice said, compared with 1936 and are considered the lowest in the company's history.

Introduction of two new series in the line also was announced. The company described them as the series 50 Super and the series 70 Roadmaster.
