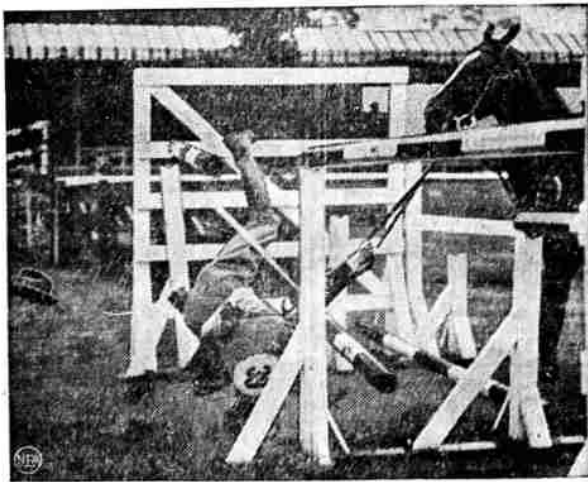

SALE OF TIMBER KLAMATH INDIAN RESERVATION, SADDLE MOUNTAIN UNIT. Sealed bids in duplicate on forms provided therefor, marked outside "Bid, Saddle Mountain Timber Unit," and addressed to the "Superintendent, Klamath Agency, Oregon," will be received until 2 o'clock p. m. Pacific time, November 3, 1939, for the purchase of merchantable timber on a tract within the Klamath Indian Reservation, Oregon, described as the Saddle Mountain Timber Unit. The Unit includes about 16,215 timbered acres with an estimated cut of 135,000,000 feet B.M., of ponderosa and sugar pines and 5,000,000 feet B.M. of Douglas fir and incense cedar, of which about 7,000,000 feet of ponderosa pine stands on about 577 timbered acres of allotted lands, for which separate approved contracts must afterward be made with allottees desiring to sell, and on terms similar to the contract for the unallotted timber. Each bid must state the price per thousand feet B.M. Scribner Decimal C Log Scale, that will be paid for timber cut and scaled prior to March 31, 1941. Prices subsequent to that date are to be fixed by the Secretary of the Interior. No bid will be considered for less than \$3.75 per thousand feet B.M. for Douglas fir and incense cedar, \$1.50 for ponderosa and sugar pines, and .75 for other species. Each bid must be accompanied by a certified check in the amount of \$15,000 on the solvent National Bank, payable to the Special Disbursing Agent, Klamath Indian Agency, Oregon. The deposit will be returned to unsuccessful bidders. The deposit of the successful bidder will be applied as part of the purchase price against timber actually cut on this Unit only, or retained as liquidated damages if the bidder shall not execute contract and furnish satisfactory bond for \$20,000 within 60 days from acceptance of his bid. The right to waive technical defects and to reject any and all bids is reserved. The contract will specify that all designated timber shall be cut and removed from the Unit prior to March 31, 1951.
