

GUARDSMEN TO ENTER FIELD TRYOUTS HERE

Three field training periods for battery D, Oregon national guard, will be held in the next six weeks, it was announced Monday by Captain T. D. Case.

Ashland's guard unit, battery B, will be here for the first period, to be held the coming weekend. The other periods are December 2, 3 and 4 and January 6, 6 and 7.

Plans for the field training call for the guardsmen to assemble at the armory, which will be made headquarters throughout the period. The men will eat and sleep at the armory.

A night march, communication practice, selection of gun positions and other operations will take place.

The field periods will in actuality be a "test mobilization," Captain Case said.

INTERSTATE ANGLER LICENSES INCREASE

WASHINGTON, Nov. 21 (AP)—The bureau of fisheries reports a steady growth in the ranks of the "interstate" angler—the fellow who often believes the fish are thicker far away.

Thirty states sold 276,552 tourist licenses to visiting fishermen for \$355,056 in the fiscal year 1938, an increase of 309 per cent in five years. Sales of the permits in Oregon numbered 11,523.

Michigan, which established an all-time high of 95,937 tourist licenses issued last year, led all states in the number of permits of this type during each annual period in the past five years.

SECURITY ACT NOTICES SENT AGED WORKERS

The federal social security board is mailing notices this week to 1932 men and women in Oregon advising them that after next January 1, they may be entitled to monthly old-age insurance checks under the amended social security act.

These notices, according to Wesley Hayes, manager of the Klamath Falls office of the social security board, are being sent to persons who have received a lump-sum settlement at age 65 under the original social security act. These persons, he said, received the settlement at 65 by having been employed at jobs covered by the social security act after January 1, 1937, and before attaining that age.

"Amendments passed by congress and signed by the president on last August now make it possible for a wage earner to qualify for the monthly payment after he is 65 even if he has received a lump-sum settlement," Hayes explained. "The amount of the settlement will, however, be deducted from the monthly payments for which he may qualify."

To receive the monthly payment after next January 1, the worker must have been employed in at least six calendar quarters since January 1, 1937, at jobs covered by the social security act and must have earned at least \$50 in wages in each quarter.

The amended law now applies to the employment of persons beyond age 65. This provision was made retroactive to last January 1 and makes it possible for a worker who had less than six calendar quarters of employment at age 65 to acquire the necessary additional quarters either in this year or at any time thereafter.

EDUCATOR TALKS ON CZECHOSLOVAKIA AT LEAGUE MEET

Miss Ruth Catlin, pioneer educator of the state and a well-known resident of Portland where she heads Catlin's school, spoke to the Klamath county chapter, League of Women Voters, on Czechoslovakia at a meeting called Monday afternoon in the city library club rooms.

Miss Catlin has been here as the guest of the league president, Mrs. E. A. Geary. Since her return from Europe Miss Catlin has spoken frequently on conditions in central Europe and especially in Czechoslovakia where she spent the greater part of a year.
