MALIN TO GET DIAL 'PHONES ABOUT MARCH 1

Malin is to have new automatic dial telephone service in the near future. John W. Kirby, general manager of the Columbia Utilities company which serves the Malin territory, announced today that orders have been placed with the

American Automatic Electric company of Chicago, for a new automatic switchboard which will be installed at Malin.

In addition to the new switchboard, other improvements will be made simultaneously in the company's service to Malin subscribers. Each subscriber will be provided with the latest model automatic dial telephone instruments. This equipment will be similar to that which will be installed by the Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company in Klamath Falls during the coming year.

The company is also adding additional trunk circuits between Merrill and Malin to better accommodate long distance and information calls. With the installation of these improvements, Malin will enjoy modern telephone

service, equal to that of any large city in the country, Kirby asserted. It is hoped to have the new facilities installed and in operation by March 1.

Of particular interest to Malin subscribers is the statement by Kirby that no increase in exchange rates will be asked. It is hoped by the company that installation of the new facilities will result in sufficient new subscribers to justify the investment without asking for increased exchange rates, he said.

Similar improvements at some of the company's other exchanges will depend upon the maintenance of present growth and the financial resources of the company, Kirby stated.

DRUNKEN DRIVING CASE APPEAL SET

Dr. J. W. Waters, found guilty on a drunk driving charge in police court, advised Police Judge Carl K. Cook that he would appeal his case to circuit court. It will be the first appeal of the kind here in several years.

Dr. Waters was arrested by city officers September 23 and he entered a plea of not guilty to the charge, posting \$100 bail. He was tried without jury November 14 and sentence postponed until December 9 at which time he was

fined \$100 and 30 days in jail, his license suspended for a period of one year. Dr. Waters is represented by E. E. Driscoll, attorney.

Mrs. P. J. Halousek, arrested October 26 on a drunk driving charge, entered a plea of not guilty and was tried December 9 in police court at which time she was found guilty and sentenced to \$100 and 30 days in jail, driver's license suspended for a period of one year. Mrs. Halousek paid her fine and sentence was suspended.
