

DRUNK DRIVING FILM PRAISED BY OFFICIALS

The growing menace of drunk driving, conceded among law enforcement bodies and traffic safety committees to be the most serious of all deliberate traffic law violations, has become a national problem of such import as to deserve exploitation through every possible channel of contact with the automobile driving public, national safety bodies, official and unofficial, declare. In Klamath Falls this important task has been taken in hand by the Citizens' Traffic Safety Council, a young organization but one, fast becoming active in its extensive work.

In line with this safety program is the motion picture screen's contribution of the reenactment of an actual case history of broken lives and hearts. The picture, entitled, "Drunk Driving," comes to the Pelican theatre screen Friday and Saturday of this week. This picture very recently received the annual award of the National Safety Council as the film most significantly advancing the cause of safety, and the announcement of its presentation locally brought the following statements and com-

ments from various local official and non-official organizations:

"The feature entitled 'Drunk Driving' should be seen by every member of the family, including both parents and children. It is a human dramatization of the evils and disaster caused by drunken driving.

"According to national statistics 75 per cent of the accidents are attributed directly to drunken driving.

"As chief of police, I should like to ask the entire public to see this picture as an educational feature which reveals the hazards and heartaches of driving after drinking." Frank Hamm, Chief of Police.

"The greatest menace law enforcement officials have to cope with today is the drunken driver. He is always a potential killer. His automobile is as treacherous as a cat.

"One must witness a vivid portrayal of his gruesome work such as a wild careening car, flying glass, an arm or leg stuck through the windshield, cut to the bone, blood soaked occupants irreparably maimed for life to leave an indelible impression in your mind. Words are too empty to describe the picture.

"I suggest that all who are able see the educational short 'Drunk Driving' to be shown at the Pelican theatre, Friday, December 15. It is one of the series, 'Crime Does Not Pay.' It may be gruesome, but it is truthful and realistic and we must face the facts.

"I am certain that educational pictures of this nature, will help us all remove the menace of the

drunken driver from our midst." —L. L. Low.

"The Citizens' Traffic Safety Committee wishes to commend Klamath Theatres, Inc., for bringing to the city the film 'Drunk Driving' which will be shown this Friday and Saturday at the Pelican theatre.

"Traffic accident statistics reveal that approximately 75 per cent of the automobile fatalities and injuries are caused directly or indirectly by drunken driving.

"The Traffic Safety Council urges all citizens to see this picture."—John B. Ebinger, chairman Citizens' Traffic Safety Council.

"This letter is written to the public in the hopes that it may have some influence toward saving someone's life. Showing Friday and Saturday at the Pelican theatre is a picture entitled 'Drunk Driving,' which received the annual award from the National Safety Council as the outstanding safety picture of the year. It dwells on the actual case history of a certain person who drove his automobile while under the influence of intoxicating liquor.

"This film most assuredly emphasizes the fact that no one should operate a motor vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquors. I heartily recommend that the driving public see this picture without fail, and possibly by doing so a reduction in the terrible toll of traffic deaths may be brought about."—Carl K.
