WHEAT POSTS GAIN OF CENT A BUSHEL

CHICAGO, Dec. 29 (P)—Gains of more than a cent a bushel in wheat prices stimulated by a semi-official estimate that the Argentine crop is the smallest in 22 years were lost in the final minutes of trading today as selling expanded.

A Washington announcement that the wheat and flour export subsidy program would be suspended, effective January 8, except for northwest flour shipments to the Philippines attracted much attention.

Wheat closed unchanged to 1/8 higher compared with yesterday's finish, May \$1.03 1/2-c, July \$1.00 1/2-c; corn unchanged to 1/8 lower, May 58 1/2c, July 59c; oats unchanged to 1/8 higher.

WOOL VERY SLOW
BOSTON, Dec. 29 (AP-USA)—Domestic wools were mostly very slow on the Boston market today. The few inquiries being received were largely for Merino wools of foreign origin. A few sales were being closed on spot South African Merino wools at steady prices, and an occasional order was being placed for Merino wools to be imported from Australia and South America. Quotations on domestic wools were unchanged, compared with prices quoted earlier in the week, but they were largely nominal because of the lack of trading.
