NATIONAL FOREST TIMBER FOR SALE

Sealed bids will be received by the Regional Forester, Portland, Oregon, up to and including January 31, 1940, for all the live timber marked for cutting and all the merchantable dead timber marked or designated for cutting located on an area embracing about 520 acres within Secs. 11, 14, 23, and 24, T. 38 S., R. 15 E., W. 1/2, on the watershed of Fish-hole Creek, Fremont National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 3,000,000 feet B. M. more or less, of ponderosa pine timber, and an unestimated amount of sugar pine, incense cedar and white fir timber to be taken at the option of the purchaser. No bid of less than \$3.50 per M feet for ponderosa pine, \$1.00 per M feet for sugar pine and incense cedar, and \$1.50 per M feet for white fir will be considered. A cooperative deposit of \$2.20 per M feet B. M. for the total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement, in addition to the prices bid for the stumpage, will be required to cover the cost of slash disposal. \$2,500.00 must be deposited with each bid, to be applied on the purchase price, refunded, or retained in part as liquidated damages, according to conditions of sale. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Before bids are submitted, full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale, and the submission of bids should be obtained from the Forest Supervisor, Lakeview, Oregon, or the Regional Forester, Portland, Oregon.
