CHICAGO, Jan. 13 (AP)—Nervous price fluctuations over a wide range occurred in the wheat pit today as the market tried to adjust itself to unexpected strength in Winnipeg quotations and reports of additional good rains and snows over much of the grain belt, particularly in the southwest. Wheat finished with fractional net loss after being almost a cent a bushel higher at one stage. No. 2 hard wheat sold at \$1.02 per bushel in the Chicago cash grain market, about 3 cents over the May delivery.
