

ELKS SERVICES, MILITARY RITES FOR SCHORTGEN

Combining fraternal ritual with military pomp, funeral services for Henry E. Schortgen, Klamath Falls building inspector who died suddenly Tuesday morning, will be held Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock from the Elks temple.

The Elks funeral service will be conducted by members of the lodge with which Mr. Schortgen was affiliated. Graveside services will be conducted by Disabled American Veterans of which he was also a member.

Active pallbearers will be Chief of Police Frank Hamm, Sergeant Leish Ackerman, Sergeant Paul Robert, Patrolmen Fred Olin, "Happy" Brandness, and Orville Hamilton.

Honorary pallbearers will include the following representatives of the three veteran organizations with which Mr. Schortgen was affiliated: Disabled American Veterans, C. F. O'Loughlin, Lamar Townsend and Basil Harris; Veterans of Foreign Wars, Floyd Woodworth, Ray Williams, and Herman Houff; American Legion, Dr. J. Calvin Hunt, Lester Finley and Carl K. Cook.

Motorcycle escort will include two fellow officers, Lewis Arnold and Lawrence Bergmann.

At the graveside where veterans will be in charge echo taps will be sounded by two American Legionnaires, Carroll Morrison and S. V. Puckett. Members of the firing squad are also from the Legion, including Jack Franey, Les Carr, Emmett Slemore, Fred Heilbroner, Clyde Thompson, Henry W. Patrick, Elmer Merritt, and Jack Benker.

The following will attend in a body representing the city of Klamath Falls: Mayor Clifford Richmond, City Treasurer Ruth Bathany, City Engineer E. A. Thomas, City Attorney D. E. Van Vactor, Recreation Director Spec Murray, and Councilmen Charles Thomas, J. J. Keller, Rollin Cantrell, Elmer Hosking and A. A. Montgomery. All department heads and employees are expected to attend as well as representatives of all veterans organizations including Commander Samuel P. Miller of the American Legion, Commander Jake Brochtrup of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, and Commander Herman Lofdahl of the Disabled American Veterans.

Mayor Clifford Richmond announced Wednesday the city hall would close Thursday at 1:30 p. m. and remain closed throughout the balance of the day out of respect for Mr. Schortgen.

HART MOUNTAIN ACREAGE SALE TO USBS APPROVED

SALEM, Jan. 24 (AP)—The state land board approved today the sale of 14,165 acres in the Hart mountain antelope refuge in Lake county to the U. S. biological survey for \$2 an acre.

The board said it believed it was getting "an excellent price" for the land, most of which is sections 16 and 36 in each township which was given to the state by the federal government for school purposes when Oregon was admitted to the union.

The \$28,330 which the board will receive from the sale will go into the state's common school fund.

Morgenthau Says Debt Limit Should Be \$50 Billion

WASHINGTON, Jan. 24 (AP)—Secretary Morgenthau contends the limit on the federal debt should be raised to \$50,000,000,000 and the budget should be balanced by reduced expenditures and increased taxes.

Answering a barrage of questions, the treasury secretary told members of the house appropriations committee during hearings on his department's 1941 supply bill.

"I think it (the debt limit) should be raised to \$50,000,000,000."

"Do I think the budget should be balanced? Yes. Do I think expenditures should be cut down? Yes. Do I think taxes should be increased? Yes. But if you say, 'Morgenthau, what kind of taxes should there be?' I cannot answer that because I do not know."

The report of the hearings was made public today.

Morgenthau said if it was up to him he would recommend raising the debt limit from the present \$45,000,000,000 and he would "take another look" at the situation when the figure reached \$49,000,000,000.

"I am willing to say now, gentlemen, that there is no particular danger involved if congress would raise the debt limit to \$50,000,000,000," Morgenthau told the committee. "Beyond that I would not venture an opinion."

He also expressed the opinion all federal expenditures such as public works, public roads and reclamation projects should be trimmed or dispensed with temporarily in view of prospective heavy expenditures for defense.

ALASKAN DOCTOR BRINGS 900TH BABY INTO WORLD

FAIRBANKS, Alaska, Jan. 24 (AP)—"Doc" John Sutherland rolled down his sleeves after delivery of his 900th baby, and smiled as he reminisced in a scene of medical contrast.

Three-fourths of those births in 44 years, he recalled had been in "the land of the midnight sun."

There were countless dogteam races with the stork across the frozen fastnesses of Alaska and the Yukon to bring new life into isolated cabins by lantern or candle light.

But his 900th, a girl, was born yesterday in the modern delivery room of the Fairbanks hospital.

To accentuate the contrast between the far north's old and new, the same day brought a multiple demonstration by Dr. Rex Swartz of modern Alaska emergency methods. He flew 40 miles west to treat a school teacher who had been burned seriously by a lamp explosion in a Tanana river village, then returned to Fairbanks and took off again on another emergency call 140 miles distant in the old timber circle district.
