Selective advances in fractions were a trifle in the majority the greater part of the session, although numerous issues were at a standstill.

WHEAT TUMBLES TO LOWEST IN MONTH

CHICAGO, Jan. 29 (AP)—Wheat prices tumbled about two cents a bushel today to the lowest level since December 12 and were unable to show any lasting rally despite stimulated buying in cash wheat and flour due to the lower prices.
Selling touched off by moderating weather uncovered numerous stop loss orders that accelerated the downturn. Large world supplies and uncertainty over disposal of domestic wheat held under loan were unsettling factors.
Flour bookings by a large eastern baker were estimated as high as 250,000 barrels in the southwest and other bakers were reported in the market. Resulting mill purchasing of wheat helped to steady prices after the decline.
Wheat closed 2-2/8c lower than Saturday, May 96-97c July 94-95c; corn 1-3/4c down, May 94-95c; July 56-57c; oats 1-3/4c lower.
