## STOCKS UNABLE TO POST GAINS DESPITE RALLY

NEW YORK, Feb. 13 (AP)—Despite quiet strength in assorted low-priced specialties, stocks generally were unable to keep on the right foot in today's market.

Fractional advances were fairly well distributed in the forenoon, but volume dwindled on the attempted recovery.

Transfers approximated 600,000 shares.

Signs, here and there, of a slackening of the business recession, combined with bright sales and earnings statements buoyed individual stocks. Speculative contingents, though, could get little inspiration from war news or national political maneuverings.

Softening commodities, among other things, tended to cloud market sentiment. Bonds turned up in spots, especially Latin

## EARLY GAINS DROP OFF IN WHEAT PIT

CHICAGO, Feb. 13 (AP-USA)—Early gains of as much as a cent a bushel were wiped out in the wheat pit today, closing trade showing a steady to easier undertone.

The decline from early highs was led by the nearby delivery, which at one time was down to 98c, off 1c from Saturday's close, after having reached \$1.00 1/2. July, representing the new crop, scored the biggest gain of a cent at 97c, and held up better.

Wheat closed unchanged to 1/2c lower, May 98 1/2c, July 96 1/2c; corn unchanged to 1/2c off, May 56 1/2c, July 54c; oats unchanged to 1/2c lower.

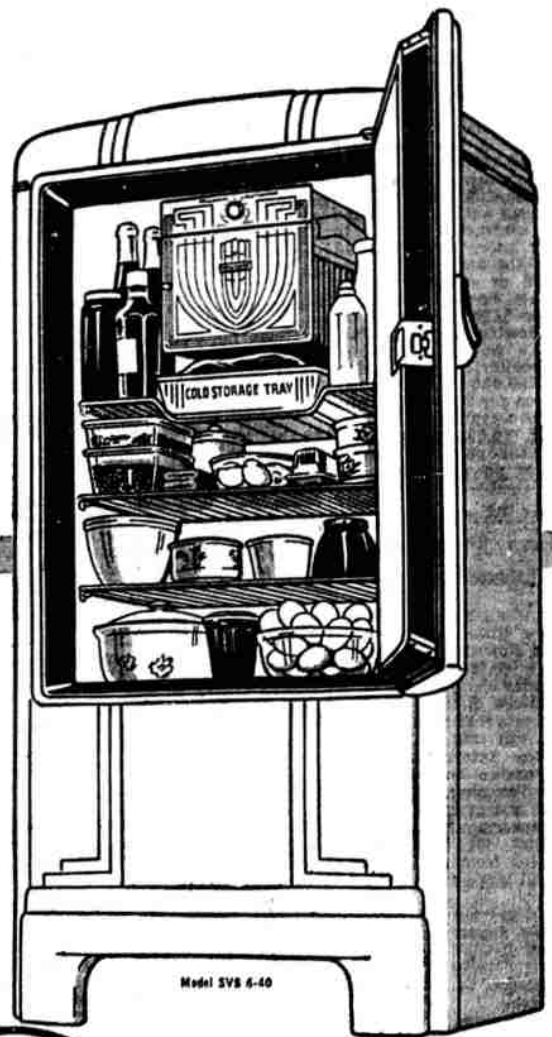
