STOCKS DROOP UNDER RAGGED SELLING PUSH

NEW YORK, Feb. 21 (AP)—Stock prices slipped fractions today under intermittent selling pressure, but erased some of the larger losses before the final bell.

Despite the declines, however, selected issues increased yesterday's gains and the average level seemed only slightly off toward the close. About 750,000 shares were unchanged.

Securities on the downside included U. S. Steel, Chrysler, Johns Manville, Standard Oil of N. J., Loft, Chesapeake & Ohio and Pennsylvania. Resistant were General Motors, Harvest, United Aircraft, Pan-American Airways, United Drug and U. S. Rubber.

Hitting new highs for the year through fractional advances were Studebaker, Twin Coach, American Crystal Sugar and Colgate.

WHEAT SOARS AS BUYING RENEWED

CHICAGO, Feb. 21 (AP)—Another wave of buying swept wheat prices upward more than two cents a bushel today, to within fractions of the peaks reached yesterday.

Buying was associated with reports of improved flour business, Canadian export sales and war news from Europe, the most alarming of which was the Russian bombing raid on a Swedish frontier village.

Wheat futures closed 1-1/8 cents higher than yesterday, May \$1.054-1/8c, July \$1.034-1/8c, corn unchanged to 1c up, May 57-1/8c, July 57-1/8c; oats 4-1/8c higher.

GRAVEL ORDERED FOR POE ROAD

It was expected that the service, on rural route 2, will be resumed the latter part of this week. Several residents of the upper valley have been forced to come down for some distance to get their mail, due to the impassable road conditions.
