Tasty Nibbles Suitable for Snack at Tea

A snack for tea is often the nourishment of friendship.

Tea Fruit Squares (24 squares)

Three eggs, 1 cup sugar, 1 teaspoon vanilla extract, 1/3 cup flour, 1 teaspoon baking powder, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1 cup chopped dates, 1 cup seedless raisins, 2/3 cup chopped nuts, powdered sugar.

Separate eggs, beat yolks until lemon colored. Add sugar and vanilla to yolks, combining thoroughly. Sift together flour, baking powder and salt; add to the egg mixture. Add finely chopped dates, raisins, and finely chopped nuts. Mix well. Beat the egg whites until stiff and fold into mixture. Spread into a well greased 2-quart utility dish and bake in moderate oven (350 deg. F.) for 30 to 35 minutes. Cut while warm into squares and sprinkle with powdered sugar.

Cream Cheese Cookies One package (3 oz.) cream cheese, 1/2 cup butter, 1/2 cup sugar, 1 egg yolk, 1 cup flour, 1/2 teaspoon vanilla.

Cream the cheese and butter together. Add the sugar, beaten egg yolk, flour and vanilla. Roll thin and cut with a cookie cutter. Bake in a moderate oven (350 deg. F.) until delicately browned.

Pecan Tart's Crunchiness Teams Up Well With Coffee

Tarts spiked with coffee will chase dullness out of any menu. They crunch deliciously and taste good. Better try them.

Coffee Butter-Pecan Tarts (6 tarts)

Three-quarters cup light brown sugar, 1/3 cup flour, 2 eggs, 1 cup double-strength freshly-made coffee, 1 cup milk, 2 tablespoons butter, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 1/2 cup chopped salted pecans, 6 baked individual pastry shells, 1 cup heavy cream, whipped; 6 pecan halves.

Combine and mix sugar and flour, add the beaten eggs. Scald coffee and milk, stir slowly into the egg mixture. Cook over boiling water for 5 minutes, stirring constantly; cook 10 minutes

longer, stirring occasionally. Add butter, cool. Add vanilla and chopped pecans. Fill pastry shells and top with whipped cream. Garnish with pecan halves.

Date Pie Supreme (Serves 6)

Dates and nuts blend tastily in a pastry shell.

One cooked pastry shell, 2 cups dates, 1 cup water, 2 tablespoons orange juice, 1 cup whipping cream, 2 tablespoons powdered sugar.

Cook the dates and cold water together in a saucepan until thick paste is formed. Remove from fire, add orange juice and let stand until cold. Just before serving, pour into a baked pie shell and cover with the sweetened whipped cream.
