the addition of the third floor, but enlargement of the mezzanine, placing of convenient, wide stairways, and other changes which will be announced later.

The Klamath Falls branch of the J. C. Penney company opened here in November, 1937, and increase in patronage of the store has made the proposed changes necessary, Elliot stated.

Included in the new plans will be the use of matching brick in construction of the third story. Local labor will be used entirely. Additional stockroom space will make for greater convenience in shopping at Penney's, it was pointed out, by the creation of wider aisles to enable a broader presentation of merchandise in each of the many departments.

The new stairs will be gently graduated for the convenience of customers, Elliot remarked, and streamlining of the main floor with modern fixtures and display lights.

Work on the third story will be started first to make it more convenient for the shifting of departments when actual work is started on the other floors.

Addition of the third floor will make for larger and more convenient "lay away" facilities. Rest rooms will be easily accessible and modern in detail.

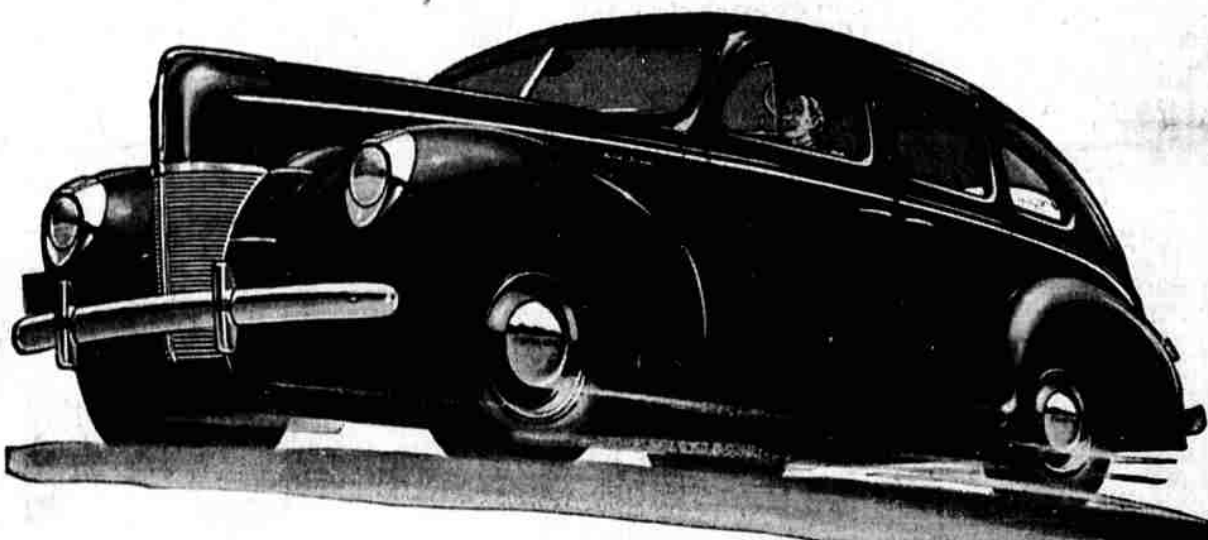
