## HOME REPORTS CHILL MARKET NEAR CLOSING

NEW YORK, March 21 (AP)—Stock market buyers pumped a little more fuel into aircrafts and specialties today, but even favorites weakened in the tail-end of the session.

European affairs, particularly intensification of aerial warfare, brought further stimulation for the plane group at the opening. Spotty business trends in home sectors, however, served to chill bullish proponents for various industrials. Best advances, running at a point or so for selected issues in the morning, were cut down substantially or eliminated after mid-day. Closing prices were moderately mixed.

## NERVOUS TRADING CHIPS WHEAT BIDS

CHICAGO, March 21 (AP)—Nervous price fluctuations characterized wheat trading today as the market absorbed profit taking sales and hedges placed against loan wheat coming into commercial channels.

This resulted in a fractionally lower close although prices at one stage were almost a cent higher than yesterday due partly to continued buying based on European development. Some purchasing was inspired by further extension of the wheat re-sealing program, which may involve a small additional portion of the 1939 crop which has been held back from market under the ever-normal granary plan.

Wheat closed 1-1/2c lower than yesterday, May \$1.05-1/2c, July \$1.03-1/2c; corn unchanged to 1/2c, May 56-1/2c, July 57-1/2c; oats 1/2c lower.
