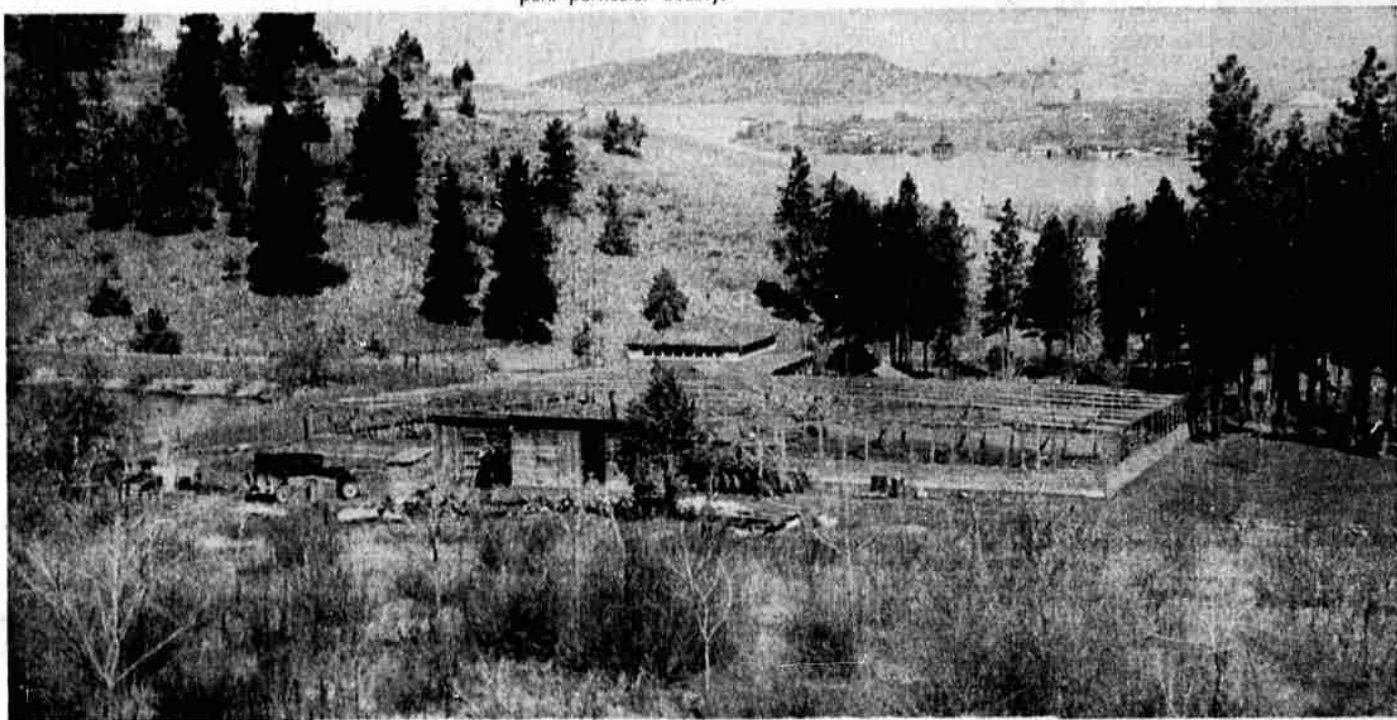


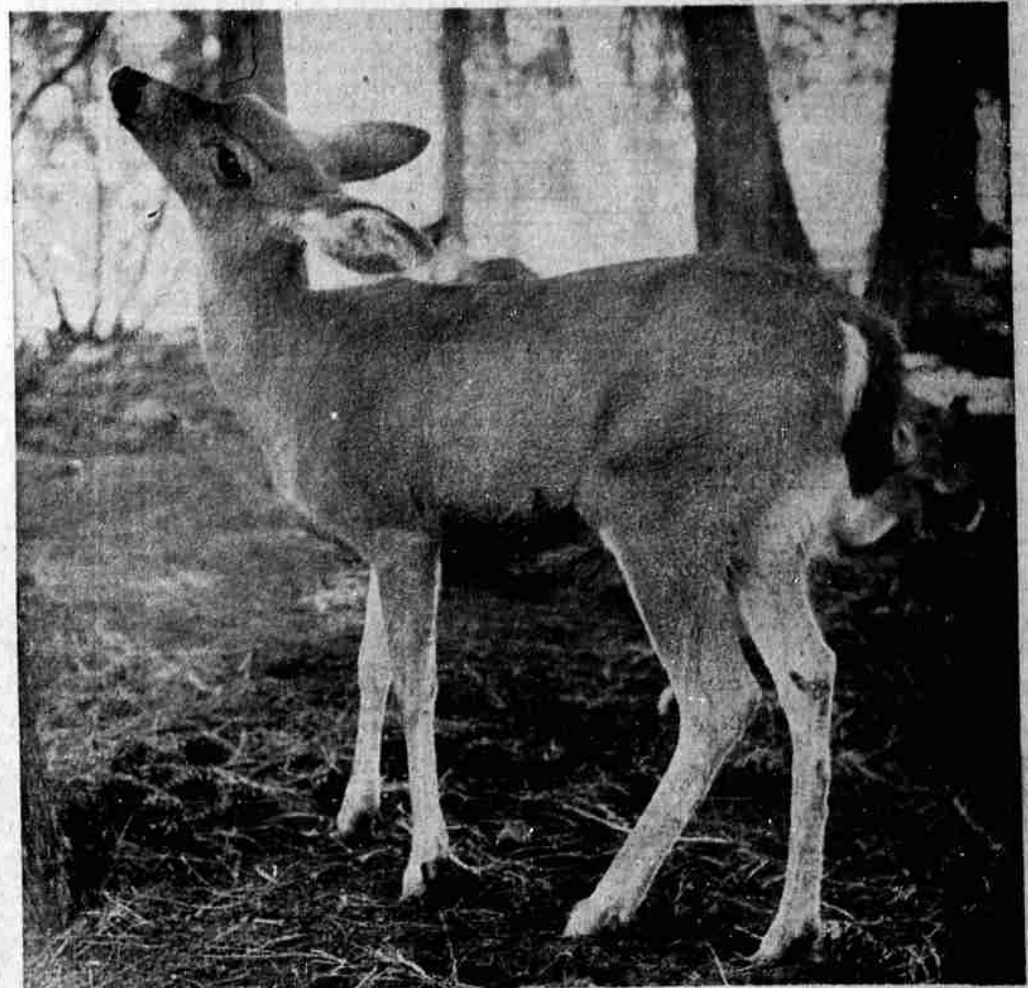


Long shadows cast by slanting rays of the sun give this bit of landscape in the park particular beauty.

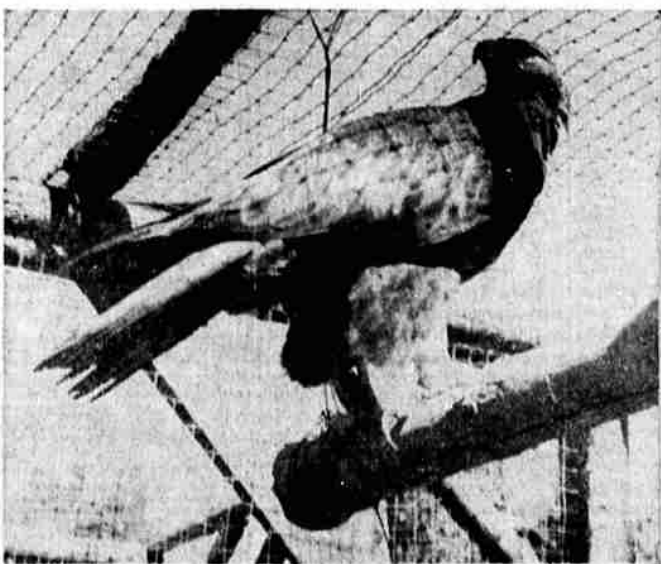


Looking toward Upper Klamath lake, the cameraman caught this general view of the animal pens.

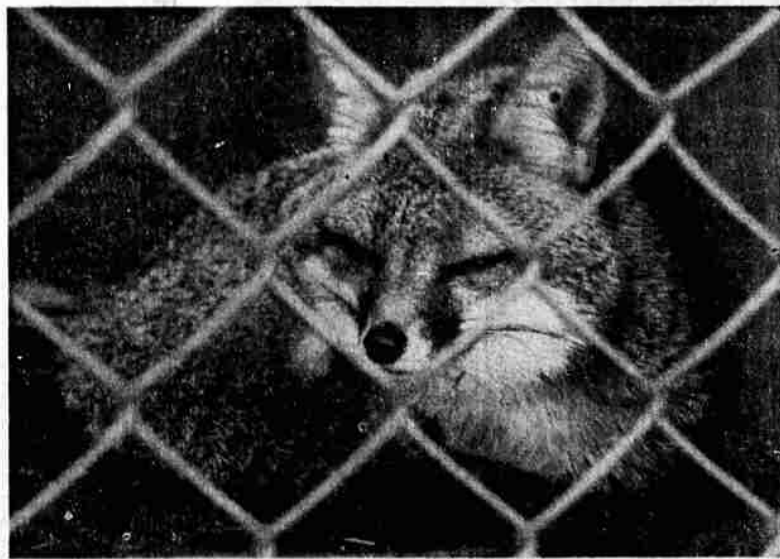
Spring comes TO MOORE PARK

One of the noblest of the captive birds at the park is this eagle.



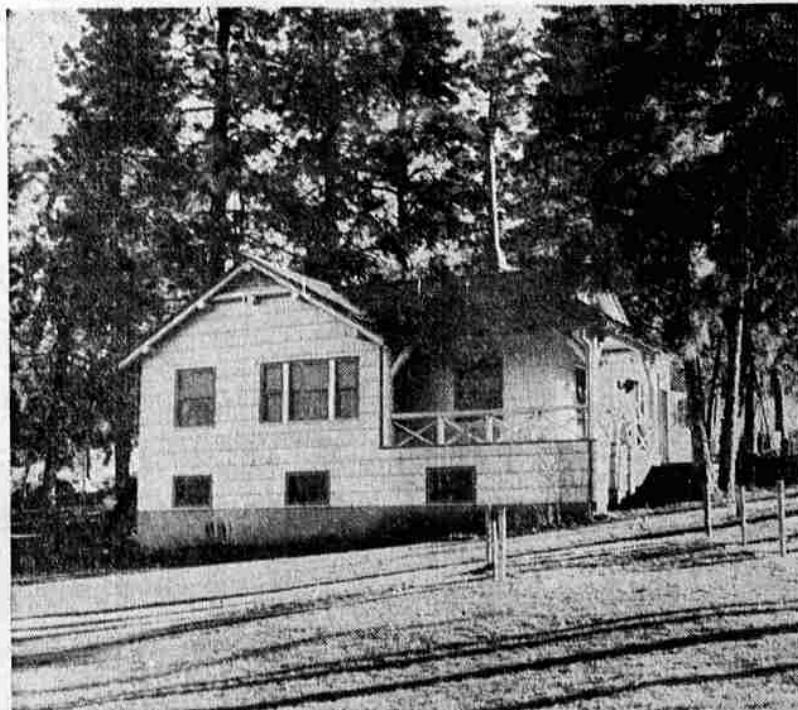
This little fox, caught in a drowsy mood, had nothing to say as its picture was taken.



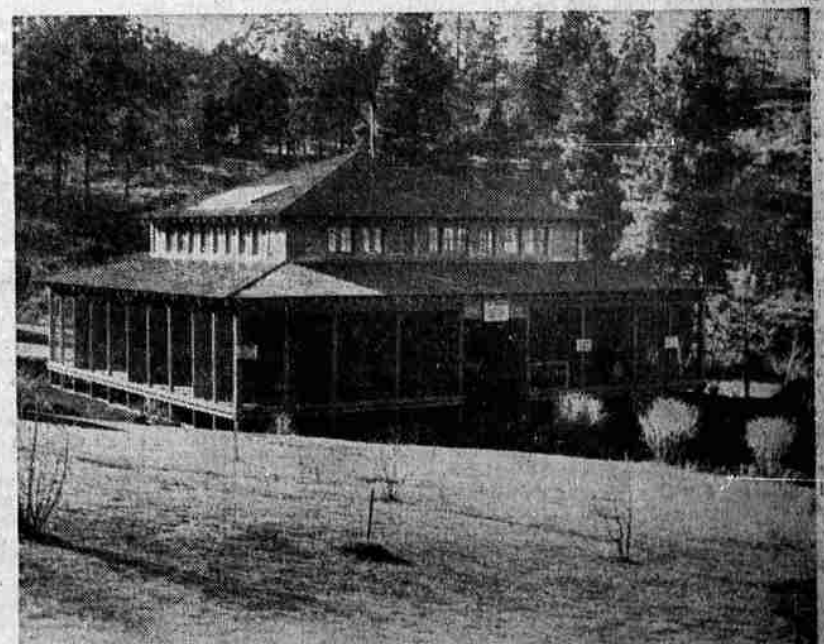
Warm spring weather recently brought these brown bears out of winter hibernation.
