

LOGGING SHOW SET SATURDAY MORNING HERE

Logging machinery of all types will be placed on exhibition Saturday at an open lot on the intersection of Market and Spring streets, in conjunction with the Western Pine Logging conference underway at the Willard hotel.

Robin Manary of the Con-whit company, chairman of the exhibition committee said that all loggers and lumbermen of the basin are invited to make an inspection of the equipment. The display will be continued throughout the day and machinery experts will be on hand to explain and demonstrate the newer types.

The display will include logging tractors, drums, arches, trucks and trailers and other machinery. The equipment is being assembled by various dealers of the Klamath basin.

Chairman Manary said a large attendance of delegates to the Western Pine conference and others connected with the logging industry is expected to visit the exhibit.

Manary is being assisted by Dan A. Howard of the West-Baker corporation and Nelson Reed of Reed Tractor and Equipment company.

Recently purchased by the French army was a "mobile airport," which is a truck weighing 13 tons, and containing everything necessary to repair planes. The truck will travel at a top speed of 40 miles an hour on highways.

Soon to start will be the plan combining passenger train and automobile rental service. Under the plan long train trips will be broken by part-time travel in automobiles.

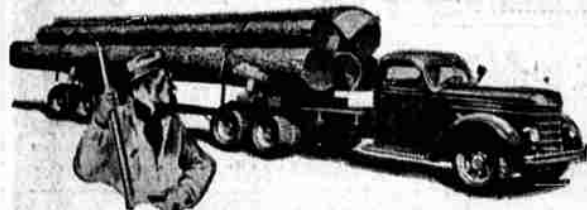

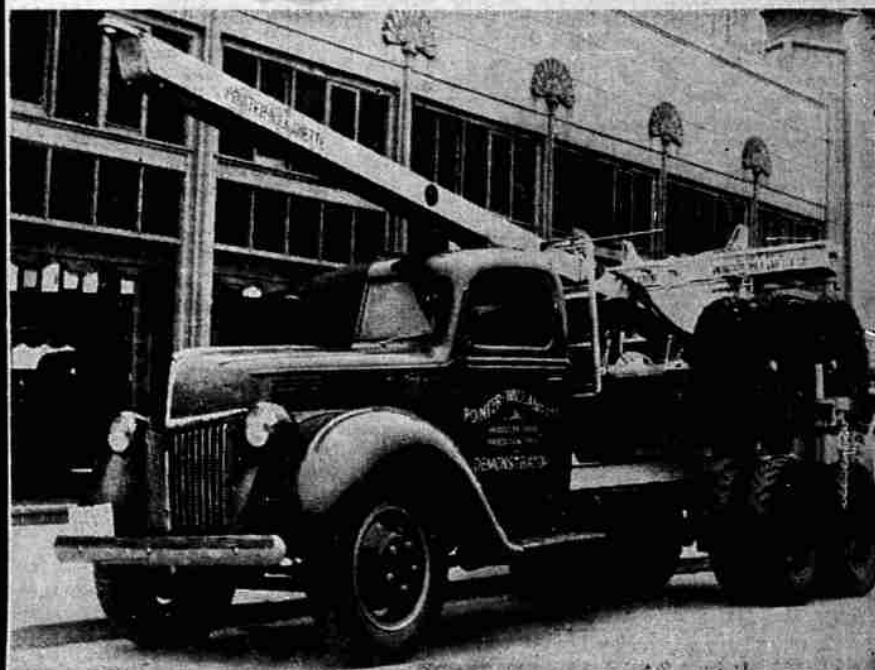
