BUDGET FOR WELFARE CUT NEXT MONTH

The Klamath County Welfare commission, in session Tuesday morning, approved the budget for the month of May which is considerably lower than that of preceding months. The budget approved by the commission was for \$14,524 which includes the social security program, administration expenses, soldiers and sailors aid, county farm and county hospital. The figure of \$4100 for general assistance was also okayed.

Twenty active old age assistance cases were presented for review during the morning hours. The commission also accepted the resignation of Katherine Wood, stenographer, who has accepted a civil service appointment in Burns in the department of the interior.

Members of the welfare staff were granted leave to attend the Oregon State conference of social workers to be held in Portland, April 17, 18, 19 and 20, it was announced by Mrs. Altha Urquhart, administrator.

A sum of \$3000 was set up for the payment of wildcat bounties during 1940 and this sum having been expended, further bounties on "cats" will not be available

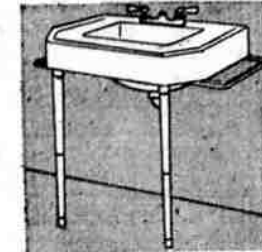
until January 1, 1941.
