Unmarried men between the ages of 17 and 23 inclusive desiring to enroll in the corps should apply to the Klamath county public welfare commission at Klamath Falls, on or before April 11, in order to fill out the necessary entrance papers.

NEW GROUP OF STAMPS ISSUED FOR COMPOSERS

Of interest to stamp collectors is the issuance of the composers group in a special series of postage stamps. Location of first-day sales is given after the name.

Following are the stamps: 1-cent, green, Stephen Collins Foster, Hardtown, Ky., May 3; 2-cent, red, John Philip Sousa, Washington, D. C., May 3; 3-cent, purple, Victor Herbert, New York City, N. Y., May 13; 5-cent, blue, Edward A. MacDowell, Peterborough, N. Y., May 13; 10-cent, brown, Ethelbert Nevin, Pittsburgh, Pa., June 10.

Stamp collectors desiring first-day cancellations of the new stamps may send not in excess of 10 envelopes to the respective offices with cash or money order to cover cost. Postage stamps will not be accepted in payment. Requests for uncanceled stamps must not be included with orders for first-day covers.

FOUR-H SUMMER SESSION SLATED

June 10 to 21 are the dates picked for the annual 4-H club summer session at Oregon State college, when close to 2000 4-H club members and leaders are expected on the campus for a two weeks' session of combined class work and recreation.
