PATIENTS GO TO INFIRMARY ON SUMMERS

Inmates of the county infirmary were moved Tuesday from temporary quarters at the fairgrounds to the new infirmary buildings on Summers lane. Bert Morrison, infirmary superintendent, had charge of the move, which was made without mishap. The inmates were quartered at the fairgrounds for nine months, following a fire June 14, 1939, which virtually destroyed the old infirmary. The new building entailed a cost of approximately \$51,600. According to members of the county court, only \$18,500 of this was an actual direct tax, the remainder being made up from insurance money and from savings effected in the care of the poor budget and other regular budget items. The new infirmary buildings are said to be one of the best plants of the kind in the Pacific northwest. Angelo Doveri was the general contractor, and the plans were prepared by Howard Perrin, architect.

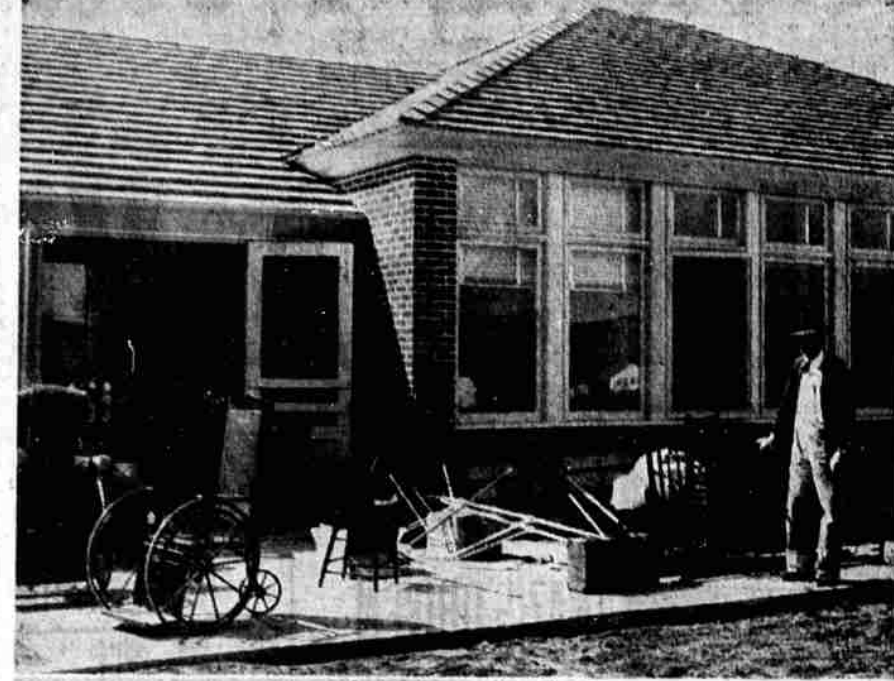

RADIO STATION "JAMS" EUROPEAN WAR REPORTS

NEW YORK, April 11 (AP)—An unidentified station today "blacked out" British news broadcasts from London, including a short-wave broadcast of the speech in commons of Winston Churchill, first lord of the admiralty. The NBC short-wave station reported that reception, up to the moment of the first "jamming" about 6:30 a. m. (PST), had been excellent. Then a buzzing noise blanketed the British signals. The "jamming" occurred again as the London station started news of Churchill's address. NBC engineers said this was caused by another station broadcasting on the same frequency.
